The Jamestown Republican, Catawba county, New York, has the following:

An improvement of much utility in the surveying compass, has been made by Dr. Silas Spencer. The compass is taken from its usual place and put on a spar, projecting at right angles from the staff, near the top. Its disk is now vertical, and the standards or sights are horizontal. A pendulum, answering to a plumb line, brings the sights to the most perfect level, and the compass is instantly converted into as perfect a leveling instrument as those made specially for leveling purposes.

It also becomes a quadrant, so far as to take exact angles of altitude and descent, and gives the exact level distance up or down steep declivities, where the chain cannot be leveled.
