His little girl dipped her bread in some of the fluid, partonk of it, and died in a few hours, suffering the most exeruclating score.

Be careful, parents, to have this preparation placed out of the reach of your little ones. Should, however, the poison be ac-cidentally taken, the white of an egg, a lib-eral dose of aweet oil, or warm water and mustard should be instantly administered, and medical aid promptly obtained. Vomiting, the stomach pump, anything which will cause the ejection of the poison may save life if the proper antidotes be immedi-ately administered.
