TALK OF THE TOWN.

The sky is still overcast. The comet wanes "wisely." Attend Conference to-morrow. News is becoming scarce again. Considerable sickness among children. John Wall has been admitted to citizenship. The Stake Conference convened this morning. Another rehearsal of the "Octoroon" to-night. Calls are daily made for tradesmen and laborers. Don't fail to attend Derr's benefit Monday night. Ice formed on water in Parley's Park on Thursday. The Supreme Court re-convenes one week from to-day. Meetings in the various wards to-morrow evening, as usual. Number 3 of the Beaver Enterprise is at hand. Where is number 2? Meetings will be held at 10 a. m. and 2 p. m. in the Tabernacle, to-morrow. Conference was held to-day in the Assembly Hall; to-morrow it will be in the Tabernacle. Lehi Curtis has taken 300 head of stock to the summer range on Blacksmith's Fork. Beaver's earthquake on Saturday last shocked Milford and Minersville as well. It is said to have been violent. The Beaver Enterprise wants to know how to spend the "Fourth" without spending so much money. Get on a "Liberal" Committee. Calamities never come singly. Following hard upon the earthquake shock last Saturday, the unhappy town of Beaver is next to have a walking match. In the case of Z. C. M. I. vs. O. J. Hollister, proceedings have been stayed until October 1, 1881, within which time the defendant may file his notice and statement for a new trial, etc. The Y. M. M. I. A. Quarterly Conference of Weber Stake, convenes in Ogden to-morrow at 10 a. m. Pres. Joseph F. Smith and Apostles Wilford Woodruff and F. D. Richards are expected to attend. Prof. K. G. Maesser, Principal of the B. Y. Academy, and Messrs. R. Maesser and J. E. Talmage, have started on an educational tour through Southern Utah. They will go as far as St. George. A gentleman named Blockman, from Idaho, had his right leg amputated yesterday at St. Mary's Hospital. The operation was performed by Dr. J. M. Benedict, in the presence of several other surgeons. A son of J. Stewart, of Springfield, had his left leg broken several days ago, while grading in Fish Creek Canyon. A rock from the hillside, above the young man, rolled down and struck him on the back part of the leg, just above the ankle, breaking the bone and forcing it through the skin so that it protruded out, almost sticking in the ground. Dr. Pike attended him.

LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

Regents' Meeting.—The special meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of Deseret will be held on Tuesday the 12th, instead of Monday the 11th inst., at 12 m. o'clock, at President Taylor's office. Trenton Topics.—E. H. writes from Trenton, a new settlement in Cache Valley, on the 5th inst: Dry farming is a success this year. Grain will soon be ripe, and promises are fair for a good crop. More settlers are wanted. Plenty of good land untaken, and an abundance of water in Bear River. An office has recently been opened there, and Trenton will henceforth be heard from occasionally. The "Octoroon."—Rehearsals of this celebrated play, to be presented on Monday evening as a benefit to Mr. William Derr, are in progress, and as will be seen from the bills and posters, the piece has been excellently cast. Mr. Derr, who has faithfully filled the position of Theatre Janitor for the last quarter of a century, is worthy of a good rousing house, and we hope the public will appreciate this fact by coming out in force to his benefit. Hennefer Notes.—Hennefer had a quiet but pleasant celebration of the 4th. The Declaration was read by Master Wm. Ure, and an oration was delivered by James Ure. The health of the people is generally good. Sunday and day schools are in good running order. Promises are flattering for a heavy harvest. Potatoes have been hurt some by frost. Water is troublesome, from the Weber falling so fast. W. G. Brewer sends the above items, under date of the 6th inst. Album of Salt Lake City.—Mr. James Dwyer, the popular bookseller, has on hand at his establishment a supply of elegant albums, containing fine views of the principal streets and buildings of Salt Lake City. The front picture is of the city, looking south-east, with the Wasatch Mountains in the background; then follow successively East Temple Street, Temple Block with Tabernacle, and unfinished Temple, the Assembly Hall, Design of Salt Lake Temple, Zion's Cooperative Mercantile Institution, Deseret Bank Building, Walker House, Continental Hotel, City Hall, Theatre, Methodist Church, Saint Paul's Episcopal Chapel, Residence of the late President Brigham Young, including Lion House (partially), the Church Offices, Bee-line House and the Eagle Gate, the Garfield House, May or Little's Residence, St. Mark's School, Presbyterian Church, and Great Salt Lake at the Black Rock bathing resort. At the back of the book is a series of short articles descriptive of each of the foregoing collections. They are a class of gems, very valuable and convenient to tourists as well as to local residents. Every house should have one of these albums. The work was done in Munich by a German, and is that passed through here some time ago, and whom Mr. Dwyer employed to prepare this fine series of views.

County Central Committee.—Pursuant to the call heretofore published, a meeting of the People's Central Committee for Salt Lake County, was held at noon to-day, in the Council House. The meeting was called to order by the chairman, Hon. John Sharp, and the roll was called by the Secretary, Theodore McKean Esq. Quorum present. It was moved and carried that the Salt Lake County Convention be held at the County Court House, on Saturday, July 23, 1881, at 11 a. m. On motion it was decided that primary meetings be held in the several County precincts, on Monday evening, the 18th inst., at 8 p. m., for the purpose of electing delegates to attend the County Convention. It was also decided that the basis of representation in the several precincts should be the same as last year. The Act relating to the apportionment of legislative representation, passed at the last session of the Legislature, associated Salt Lake County with Tooele and Davis Counties in the nomination of Councilors to the Legislature, and with Davis and Morgan Counties for the nomination of representatives. Accordingly a motion was made and carried, that Davis County be respectfully invited to send five delegates, and Tooele County five delegates, to meet 32 delegates from Salt Lake County in a Council District Convention, to be held July 23, at 12 m., in the County Court House, for the purpose of putting in nomination four Councilors to the Legislative Assembly. A motion was also made that a representative district convention, composed of 39 delegates, be called to meet at the Court House, on the same day, at 12:30 p. m., and that Davis County be respectfully invited to send five delegates and Morgan County two delegates, to meet with 32 delegates from Salt Lake County, to place in nomination six representatives to the Legislative Assembly. This motion was carried, after which the meeting adjourned sine die. For the benefit of our readers, and as a reminder to the officers of the several counties, we append the first two sections of the law passed by the Legislature of 1880, in relation to legislative apportionment: Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah: That at the General Election, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-one (1881), and biennially thereafter, Cache and Rich Counties shall elect one Councilor to the Legislative Assembly; Box Elder and Weber Counties, one; Wasatch, Uintah, Summit and Morgan Counties, one; Salt Lake, Davis and Tooele Counties, four; Utah and Juab Counties, two; Sanpete, Sevier and Emery Counties, one; Millard, Beaver, Iron and Piute Counties, one; Washington, Kane and San Juan Counties, one. Sec. 2. At the General Election in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-one (1881), and biennially thereafter, Cache and Rich Counties shall elect two Representatives to the Legislative Assembly; Box Elder, Uintah, Summit and Morgan Counties, one; Salt Lake, Davis and Tooele Counties, six; Tooele County, one; Utah and Juab Counties, four; Sanpete, Sevier and Emery Counties, two; Millard County, one; Beaver and Piute Counties, one; Iron and San Juan Counties, one; Washington and Kane Counties, one. As will be seen above, it was in accordance with this apportionment, which supersedes that of the former law, that action was taken at to-day's meeting. Congressional Visitors.—Hon. Clarkson N. Potter, Member of Congress from the State of New York, is in the city. Mr. Potter is well known as one of the most prominent members of the Democratic party. He was the chairman of the celebrated Potter Investigating Committee. Hon. H. H. Rockwell, a member of the New York legislature travels with Mr. Potter, and is also in the city. Hon. George Ainslie, Congressional delegate from Idaho, arrived here last night, and registered at the Walker. He will attend to some mining business, and will remain over until Monday. Sudden Death.—A sudden death occurred on Thursday in the family of Bishop Peterson, of the Second Ward. His son, a bright, healthy little fellow, who had attended the morning's fast meeting with his father, while playing with some other children, suddenly rolled over and expired in an instant. Dr. Benedict was summoned, but was unable to account for the extraordinary occurrence. The child seemed to be in perfect health. It was a sad blow, and the bereaved parents are the objects of much sympathy.
