

TAFT GUEST OF YALE GRADUATES

Came from All Parts of United States to Greet First Son of Eli to be President.

SANG THE GOOD OLD SONGS.

Preparations Taken to Guard Him Exceeded Anything Ever Seen in New York.

New York, March 19.—With songs of the football field and the boat race course, with a cheering cheer and a shouting chorus of "Hail" to good old Yale, drank her down, President Taft was greeted tonight as the first Yale president of the United States to more than 1,500 graduates of the university. The graduates came from all over the country. They ranged from alumnus of the Yale school of medicine to the date of his down to the youths who left their alma mater only last June.

THE DINNER.—The dinner was served at the Waldorf-Astoria. The handsome ballroom was decorated with a lavish display of flowers. From the ceiling, countless chains of pink blossoms fell in graceful loops. The balcony, and the side walls were festooned with garlands. The speakers' table at which President Taft sat with President Hadley of Yale, and other distinguished graduates, was crowded with official representatives of the class of Yale. Back of the table was a huge drop curtain bearing a painting of the old Yale hall, which was a reality in President Taft's student days, but which is now merely a memory.

In front of the curtain and back of the speakers was a replica of the old Yale fence. The representation of the old fence was complete down to the last detail. Many of the guests, including the "W. H. H." of Mr. Taft and the "A. H. H." of President Hadley were faithfully reproduced.

An orchestra played Yale melodies throughout the evening, and the singing of the college songs was led by a glee club of 35 graduates seated at a center table.

President Taft was probably the happiest man at the dinner. He was given entirely in his honor. He was not hailed as president, however, but as "Bill"—the satisfaction which motivated the cheering at his entrance.

TOASTS AND SONGS

While the dinner was being served, many graduates, including the host from his class of '74, made their way to the president's table, shook hands with him, and then returned to the banquet hall. The toast of the evening was made by President Taft and President Hadley. The latter spoke first, responding to the toast, "South the Elm," which the former, speaking entirely extemporaneously, had for his subject, "For God, for Country and for Yale."

There were other informal speakers among the guests at the dinner were Henry W. Taft and Horace D. Taft, brothers of the president.

TAFT EULOGIZES YALE

It was nearly 11 o'clock when Mr. Taft began to speak, and as he was leaving on the midnight train for Washington, his remarks necessarily were brief. He confined himself almost entirely to an eulogy of Yale and of the Yale spirit, which he declared had been a guiding influence in his life.

Mr. Taft said he was carrying the Yale spirit with him to the discharge of his duties as president.

"And," he added, "it is a great deal better to leave that office with the plaudits of your countrymen than to enter it with the opportunity for mistakes, the opportunity for failure, the opportunity of a dead level of doing nothing, are so many that I look forward with great hesitation and reluctance to the results of the next four years."

TALK TO GRADUATES.

"Men of Yale," he said, "I have made in the last six months more than 400 speeches, but none of them presented the difficulties of this occasion. I have a brother's affection for every Yale man within the sound of my voice, and I desire to express to them my personal gratitude for their joining in this occasion and for the expression of the feeling which I take it is a feeling of affection for me."

"As I look back upon my life, it seems to me that I have been a Yale man from the first time I had consciousness. From early youth I have been breathing in Yale atmosphere. No one could live under the shade of my father's influence without being a Yale man, and what success has come to me I attribute most largely to the spirit of Yale. My father, when he went to Yale, had to walk all the way from Vermont and back again. He did not have such a thing as a dress suit up to the time of the senior commencement, when he hired a Baptist preacher to make him one. I tell you these incidents of my father to show you all the influence that has been in our home."

"They were Yale all the way through."

"Of course, we were not all orthodox in our home. You may have gathered something of this from what happened during the recent campaign. But those who had doubts along that line might have had their minds cleared and their fears allayed by the spirit of the atmosphere which comes with the atmosphere and influence of Yale."

Comments upon some remarks which President Hadley had made as to changes at Yale, Mr. Taft said he believed the tone of the institution was morally higher today than it had ever been before.

"And," he added, "the spirit that Yale has handed down for more than 200 years is still strong to accomplish these great purposes for which it was intended."

CUBAN UPRISING A SIGNAL FAILURE

Havana, March 18.—The uprising in Santa Clara province that ended itself by the defection of seven members of the rural guard, who fled to the woods with their arms and horses, has resulted in complete failure. Early today the government received a dispatch from Gen. Montenegro, at Remedios, saying that Sergeant Cortes, his two sons and the four other men making up the fugitive party, had come in voluntarily and surrendered to Pedro Bofas.

The prisoners probably will be tried before a special court-martial.

POLICE STATISTICS ON EXECUTIONS IN RUSSIA

St. Petersburg, March 18.—The committee of the duma that has been examining the proposed bill for the abolition of the death penalty in Russia has been furnished by the police department with statistics regarding activity of the military courts from Jan. 1, 1904, to Jan. 1, 1909. According to this information, there were during this period, 2,839 condemnations to death and 1,435 executions. There were 683 additional executions under the special draconian court-martial law which was effective Aug. 1, 1906, to May 1, 1907.

The commission had decided that it is necessary to retain the death penalty for the most serious crimes in regions still under the system of "exceptional laws."

WOULD LIMIT DEBATE ON TARIFF

General Disposition in House to Cut Out, as Far as Possible, All Academic Discussion.

DESIRE IS NON-PARTISAN
