

FIRE IN CHICAGO.

The Old Apartment Building Burned to the Ground.

THREE PERSONS CARRIED OUT. No Lives Lost, Though Many Seriously Injured—Sixty Persons Less Everything.

CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—Thirty persons were rescued from their beds in the Old Apartment Building, 609 and 611 Washington avenue, a little before 2 o'clock this morning by an alarm of fire. They awoke to find their rooms filled with smoke, and their only means of escape was to jump from the windows. Thirty persons were rescued from the building, and the rest were taken to the street in their night clothes; others were overcome by the smoke that they had to be dragged from their beds and carried out unscathed by the firemen.
