The case of alleged malicious destruction of property against William Williams, Arthur Egan and William White, members of the Democratic club, was heard yesterday afternoon before Commissioner Wardlaw. The defendants demanded a jury trial and considerable time was consumed in the hearing. When at last it was ready to go to the jury, the defendants asked for a continuance, on the ground that an important witness was absent and could not be obtained. The request was denied. From the evidence it appeared that the defendants had destroyed the property of the plaintiff, and the jury was to hear the case.

Captain B. C. de Livero, late commandant of the Mormon army, who was held and confined in the American Hotel, C. H. White in charge, was yesterday released before Commissioner Wardlaw on a complaint sworn to by John McFarlane, charging him with transportation. He was released on a bond of \$100,000, and will be given a hearing this morning. The complaint alleges that on or about November 15th, 1892, he was taken to the American Hotel, and confined there for several days, and that he was treated in a cruel and oppressive manner.

Captain Thomas Cane, superintendent of the Boston and Montana Smelting company of Butte, was an Ogden visitor yesterday. The captain has great faith in Ogden's future and he intended to visit the city at five points, having made several thousand dollars' investment there through B. F. Deary, and contemplating making several important improvements in the early spring.

Because nothing has been said of late regarding the Rio Grande Western shops and roundhouse, the people of Ogden must not think that project has been abandoned. The railroad has purchased from the Colorado Coke and Iron company the old iron works site and the construction and new building will be commenced. Work will commence on the necessary buildings in the spring.

The great train for the Ohio and Utah Natural Gas company's gas well outfit should reach Ogden by Monday, having been shipped from Findlay, Ohio, over ten days ago. Immediately upon their arrival the derricks will be constructed and active work commenced. The exact location of the first well to be put down has not yet been decided upon.

The Ogden Chamber of Commerce, which has been allowed, through lack of interest, to run down and die a lingering death, will be reorganized and have new life infused into it. A committee has been appointed to draft a new set of by-laws and constitution and at an early date a public meeting will be called to discuss their adoption.

The Rio Grande Western westbound passenger train left Ogden this morning at 10:00 o'clock, the train being composed of a freight wreck at the freight depot. The damage to the freight train was not slight.

The damage case of William Driver & Co. vs. Thomas J. Stoyne et al., which was decided two days ago in the Fourth district court in favor of the plaintiff, may be appealed to the supreme court of the Territory.

The meeting of the arbitration commission which will try and settle the existing difficulties between the Typographical Union and the Post has been postponed until Monday on account of the enforced absence of one of the commission.
