### TUCKER IS RELEASED.

Scattle Officials Have No Knowledge Of Crime Confessed.

Al V. Tucker, alias P. C. Wallace, who gave himself up to the police Tues. day evening saying that he was wanted In Seattle for the theft in 1907 of a \$250 draft, was released from custody last night after Chief of Police Barlow received a telgram from Chief of Po-lice Ward of Seattle, advising that no such man was wanted there, nor did the Washington city department have any knowledge of the crime confessed to have been committed.

Tucker told a story of how he had found a letter containing a draft of \$250, and had appropriated the money. He gave as his reason for confessing to the local police his crime the fact that his conscience had tortured him. and that he is now anxious to be ve-turned to Seattle and serve his penalty
