—WASHINGTON, May 4.—Private business having been dispensed with, the Senate today resumed its session of 75 minutes on the tariff bill.

Mr. Spooner, who had criticized the method of tariff reduction proposed by the committee on ways and means, said that the bill would result in a substantial decrease upon the articles of mineral and agricultural products. Committees should have provided, he contended, for an entire removal of duty on sugar. That course would take it from the food of every man, woman and child in the country, and extend to every family, rich and poor. He would give a reasonable poundage for the sugar, but he would not continue to tax it. He would not support the bill. Not one person under a guile for tax reform.
