Wired from Washington.

WASHINGTON, 16.—The Society of the Army of the Potomac, whose reunion occurred here to day, had all that could be desired in the point of interest, the streets being thronged by the music of martial bands, and the streets were filled with uniformed bodies of volunteers and regular soldiers. The procession passed forty stands in front of the White House, and was reviewed by the President, Cabinet, and members of the Senate and the Army of the Potomac were received at the White House.

A general business meeting of the Society was held this afternoon, and after the transaction of routine matters President Humphreys announced the new business in the name of the Society for the ensuing year. Up to this point General Grant and unanimity had marked the proceedings. The scene, however, which ensued, and the discussion which took place in the course of the next three quarters of an hour recalled most vividly the closing scenes of the Civil War. General Grant, who was present, addressed the Society, and the members, who were seated in the aisles, responded with unanimous voices. The President then informed the Society that a force of 10,000 men would be required to move the forces of the South, and that he would call upon the members of the Society to co-operate with him in this work.

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
