THE FORTUNE MILL.

Its Operations are Said to be Effective and Smooth.

The starting up of the new mill at the Fortune mine at Binginim seems to have been a very successful affair, notwithstanding the fact that the water supply is rather limited as the resuit of extremely open winter. The supply is said to be more than suffcient in ordinary seasons, but unless a greater flow is encountered in the mine, the present supply will allow two shifts per day to be run in the mill. Regarding the mill the Bingham Bulle-tin says: The Fortune concentrator will obtract attention from millmen. It will attract attention from millmen. It presents the novel feature of having no use for elevators-something that Man-ager Hill believed practicable, and he has now proved it. A continuous journey of ore 110 feet from bins to separating tables results in clean tail-ings and a perfect product. The bins include one for storage of 300 tons, and a 50-ton hopper from which the ore is fed by improved automatic device. The machinery consists mainly of a 9x15 Blake crusher, a 3x8 trommel, Frazer & Chaimers 30x10 compromise rolls, four separators in train, four 3-compartment Hart jigs, two Wildy tables, one Frue vanner, a 50 horse power electric mo-tor and a second motor. The mill has 100 tons capacity in 24 hours. Its cost was about \$20,000. Its construction was under the direction and mill is now in charge of W. M. Young, who came here last fall from South Dakota to engage with the Fortune. He has had a wide and varied milling exderstands his business is evidenced by the splendid behavior of this plant om its start. The Fortune has a great deal of good concentrating lead ore which will be worked on for the present. Big Revolving Leaching Cylinder to

be Used-New Shaft has been Sank. The news from Sunshine is that conidenable machinery has arrived for the overland mill and quite a force of men-are at work in the mine, says the Mer-cur Miner. The shaft is now down 200 cur Miner. The shaft is now down 200 feet below the old levels and into the best quality of ore they have yet en-countered. Among the machinery that has arrived is a big revolving leaching cylinder, the invention of Manager Duncan. It is 54 inches in diameter and has a capacity of five tons per hour. The ore is fed in at one end and the revolution of the cylinder mixes the solution thoroughly with the ore allowing the values to be extracted much more quickly than by the old process of allowing the solution to per-colute through the ore in large tanks. colate through the ore in large tanks.
