Los Angeles, Cal. He is recovering from the operation one of the most delicate and conservus known to modern surgery.

At one point in the norta the wall of the artery was so thing that pressure of the blood had all but blown it out. The doctors decided to interpose an artificial wall in front of the weakened spot. An inciscen was made, disclosing the artery and a hollow needle was trust into it, puncturing the wall below the bubble. Then the fine silver wire was fed through the hole in the needle. It was so fine that when the end came in contact with the opposite wall of the artery it turned and as more wire was pushed io, it curried round and round, forming a spiral the size of the artery and thus transited along the tube, bridging the enlarged space.
