

## HOUSE OF LORDS AGAIN WARNED

Balfour of Burleigh Tells Them if  
They Win a Victory it Will  
Only be Temporary.

### BISHOP OF HEREFORD SPEAKS

London, Nov. 25.—"If you win a victory it will only be a temporary one; if you lose, you have prejudiced the position, power, prestige and usefulness of the house of lords, which I believe every one of you honors and desires to serve as heartily as I do myself."

In this homely, candid fashion Lord Balfour of Burleigh tonight told members of the house of lords his opinion of the course they are pursuing with regard to the budget. He has none of the graces of oratory which Lord Rosebery possesses, but his plain manner is not without effect, and his speech was the real event of today's sitting of the upper chamber.

It probably will have even greater influence than the words of Lord Rosebery, because Rosebery no longer holds the confidence of any party.

The bishop of Hereford, who intervened later in the debate, said that while he respected the archbishop of Canterbury's desire that the prelates abstain from voting on the measure he claimed the right to the exercise of independent judgment. If the bishops had any function to perform it was to speak for the multitudinous poor, he said.

Therefore, he supported the budget, which was a social welfare budget, based on sound finance. He was convinced, he declared, that the country's answer to an appeal to the ballot

would be in clear English that never again shall the fundamental liberties of the people be endangered by a privileged class. He wished the budget might be passed as a protection against the rapidly growing spirit of revolt among the democracy which might become dangerous.

Many other peers spoke along party lines. The debate was adjourned until Monday, when Viscount Morley, Lord Curzon and Lord Rothchild are expected to speak.

Rumors are current tonight that Conservative leaders, seeing the damaging effect that the speeches of Lord Rosebery and Balfour are likely to have on the Conservative cause in an election, are reconsidering their position with regard to the budget. But Lord Lansdowne's resolution against the adoption of the budget will go to a division and be carried by an enormous majority.

A great pro-budget demonstration took place tonight in Parliament square. Six thousand persons gathered, David Lloyd-George, chancellor of the exchequer, fifteen hundred police finally cleared the square. The demonstration probably will be repeated on a larger scale Monday and Tuesday.

## TAFT THANKFUL FOR SQUARE MEAL

Enjoyed Food—Real Food—And  
Didn't Have to Work

### HE DIDN'T MAKE ANY SPEECH.

His Thanksgiving Dinner a Genuine  
Treat—Took Long Walk  
After It.

Washington, Nov. 25.—Satiated with the "possum dinners and elaborate banquets he was forced to face in his recent trip from coast to coast, President Taft sat down this afternoon to a family Thanksgiving dinner.

The piece de resistance was a man-moth turkey that had been raised on a Rhode Island farm and looked almost mountainous in its proportions. Mr. Taft smiled genially when the dessert was served.

"Thank goodness," he sighed, happily, "I've had a dinner at which I haven't been compelled to make speeches and where no reception committee lurks in the background. I've enjoyed food—real food—and I haven't had to work to get it."

When news of the president's satisfaction percolated below stairs there was another thanksgiving ceremony. Tonight the White House chef is the proudest citizen of the District of Columbia, while his assistant sheds reflected pride.

The president had no guests. Only the Taft family was present, including Mrs. Lauchlin, sister of Mrs. Taft, Miss Helen and Charlie Taft had come from their schools.

When the dinner was over and the family had spent some time in the drawing room Mr. Taft decided that he needed exercise. Accordingly a White House attaché called Atty-Gen. Wickesham on the telephone and he arrived in a half hour.

"Let's take a walk, Wickesham," said the president. "I've got to do something to settle my dinner. I hope you enjoyed your turkey as much as I did."

The president and attorney-general then struck off on a walk that lasted more than two hours. They left the White House grounds by the rear gate and their course took them over the wind-swept stretch of Potomac bottoms well down toward Alexandria, Va. When they returned Mr. Taft looked as fresh as when he started, but Mr. Wickesham, who is not quite so volubly physically, appeared to be somewhat weary. The two separated at the White House gate.

"Goodbye, Wickesham," said the president, waving his hand. "I've enjoyed the stroll immensely."

"Good night, Mr. President," returned the attorney-general. "You certainly put me through a strenuous two hours, but I've relished every minute of it."
