PERISHED IN FLAMES

Three Women and Two Children Killed in a Burning Building.


FUJILE EFFORTS TO SAVE THEM.

The Dead Bodies Found Among the Smoking Ruins—Cause of the Disaster Unknown.

NEW YORK, March 21.—Developments prove that five instead of three persons were suffocated by smoke in the five story apartment house, 61 West 155th street, which was partially destroyed by fire yesterday afternoon. At an early hour this morning the bodies of Mrs. Adeline Desiraton and her five-year-old son Marcello were discovered between the stairs, where on the fourth floor of the building.

The night it was reported that everybody who had been in the building at the time of the fire was accounted for, but later it developed that Mrs. Darrington and her boy must have been in the room. It seems that Mrs. Darrington, who lives on the first floor, saw the fire break out, telling the janitor that they would not return until evening. The janitor thereupon supposed that the Darringtons were safe and so reported to the police. Nothing was heard from the Darringtons until the next morning, when the fire department, after a long search, located the bodies of the mother and child in the building and the police became alarmed for their safety and at once instituted a search which resulted in the finding of the bodies this morning.
