### CEDAR CITY.

DEATH OF ROBT. W. HEYBORNE.

Prominent Pioneer Citizen of Iron County Succumbs to Brief Illness.

Cedar City, Iron Co., June 7.—The sudden death of Robert W. Heyborne, which occurred Wednesday night, June 5, is greatly lamented by the people of Cedar as the deceased was a prominent figure in the community since pioneer days and was highly esteemed by all. On Tuesday evening he was stricken with paralysis, when pneumonia developed and death quickly followed.

Mr. Heyborne was born in Kilkenny, Ireland, 63 years ago and when he was very young his parents took him with them to Australia, where his father died, leaving his mother a widow with six children, of whom the deceased was the eldest. In 1857 the family arrived in Cedar City, where Mr. Heyborne has resided ever since. Early in life Mr. Heyborne was called into public service, beginning with the office of city marshal, from which he was promoted to the city

council, where he served three terms. Later he filled the office of mayor for four years. He has also been city recorder for six years. He was assessor and collector of Iron county for eight years and a member of the territorial legislature four years. He has also held many church positions which he filled with fidelity. He is survived by his wife and five daughters, two of whom are married.

It was also decided that as soon as the acreage has been ascertained what acreage can be obtained that committees will be visiting all the settlements of Sanpete and Sevier to obtain subscriptions for best raising and to do all that can be done to create interest in the erection of a sugar factory.

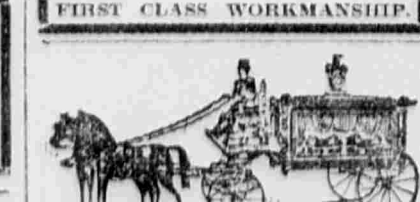
