

Adam's cotton mills at Bainbridge, Ga., burned. Loss \$30,000.

Trow & Co's. flour mill, at Madison, Ind., burned, loss \$125,000.

Michael Davitt made a violent speech at Barris, County Carlow, yesterday.

It is not considered necessary to send any more troops to the Cape at present.

The troopship *Crocodile* has arrived at Natal from India with 1,245 infantry.

Argersinger's hat and clothing house, at Johnstown, N.Y., burned, loss \$25,000.

Senator elect Platt, Governor Cornell and General J. D. Cox, visited Mentor yesterday.

Twelve fishing smacks have been wrecked in the Bay of Biscay, and 46 men drowned.

An incendiary fire at Orangeville, Ont., destroyed a grain storehouse and contents. Loss \$30,000.

Ephraim Sieger's flour mill, at Seigersville, Penna., burned, loss heavy and insurance light, incendiary.

President Hayes has approved the bill placing General Ord on the retired list with the rank of Major General.

It is now assured that no communication in regard to an insurrection in Armenia reached the foreign office.

The Boers of Orange Free State held a meeting at which they determined to send horses and cattle to the Boers in Transvaal.

Placards have been posted in London and Ballina districts, urging the people not to revolt as the time has not yet come.

Albert and Chas. E. Talbott, for the murder of Chas. E. Talbott, are sentenced to be hanged on the 25th of March, at Maryville, Mo.

General Colly telegraphs that the effect of the late engagement was not serious, except in the loss of many good officers and men.

The Shattuck pistol and breech loading shot gun manufactory at Hartford, Mass., burned to-day. Loss \$25,000; insurance \$18,000.

The *Daily News* and *Pall Mall Gazette* disapprove of the sweeping nature of the bill for the protection of life and property in Ireland.

Johnson, solicitor general for Ireland, says the government has no idea whatever as to how the jury in the Traverser's trial was divided.

The agricultural appropriation bill contains an appropriation of \$10,000 to be devoted to the reclamation of arid and waste lands in the Territories.

A heavy snow and high winds for 24 hours in Toledo, Ohio. The drifts are very high and trains are much delayed. Freight traffic is nearly suspended.

A prospectus has been issued in England for submarine telegraph company, which is to connect Central America with the United States and Europe.

The large Lediard block, Grand Rapids, Mich., occupied by druggists, burned. Loss \$30,000; insured. Mrs. Rose Lowe, living in the third story, was suffocated.

Major Walsh, of the Canadian police, said the surrender of Sitting Bull could not be accepted by Canada, his relations being in no sense those of hostiles.

The House of Commons was in session all night and up to 1 p.m. today when it was said the home rulers would be able to prolong the debate till Thursday.

Many bankruptcies are imminent in Moscow on account of the depression in Russian industries, and the minister of finance has instituted an inquiry into the cause.

A Dublin special says: Incendiary placards, which are now pronounced the work of Fenians, were posted generally in the provinces and were torn down by the police.

Dr. Washington F. Hamburg, a dentist of Piqua, Ohio, shot his wife dead and blew out his own brains. He was a drunken man, married 15 years and leaves a family.

The up express on the Northern Railway, ran off the track near Holland, Ontario, this forenoon. A man was dumped off the train and smothered in a snow bank. Several other passengers were injured.

A train consisting of 17 freight cars and a passenger coach, left the track near Gibsonville, N. C., last night, instantly killing two men, and seriously injuring another.

The losses of the Boers are estimated at 500 killed and wounded. It is reported the Boer commandant was killed. The position held by the Boers was a very strong one.

The river and harbor bill in charge of the commerce committee, and the agricultural appropriation bill, which under the new rules is reported directly to the House, will probably be completed this week.

The frame dwelling of Benjamin Campbell, near the fair grounds, St. Louis, burned between nine and ten o'clock this morning, and his mother-in-law, 90 years old, and paralyzed, was roasted to a crisp.

A recent arrival from Samoa reports the death of King Malietoa on November 8th. The country is in a state of anarchy, except the neutral territory governed by the consuls of the United States, Germany and Great Britain.

The Turcoman expedition has accomplished its object, namely to guarantee safety to Russian caravans and government will decide the course to be pursued in future after learning Gen. Skobeloff's views. So says Russian papers.

The commissioner of public lands has made the discovery that north of Texas, and between Indian Territory and New Mexico, is a parallelogram of nearly four million acres, two hundred thousand cattle, and a large number of outlaws, without any form of government.

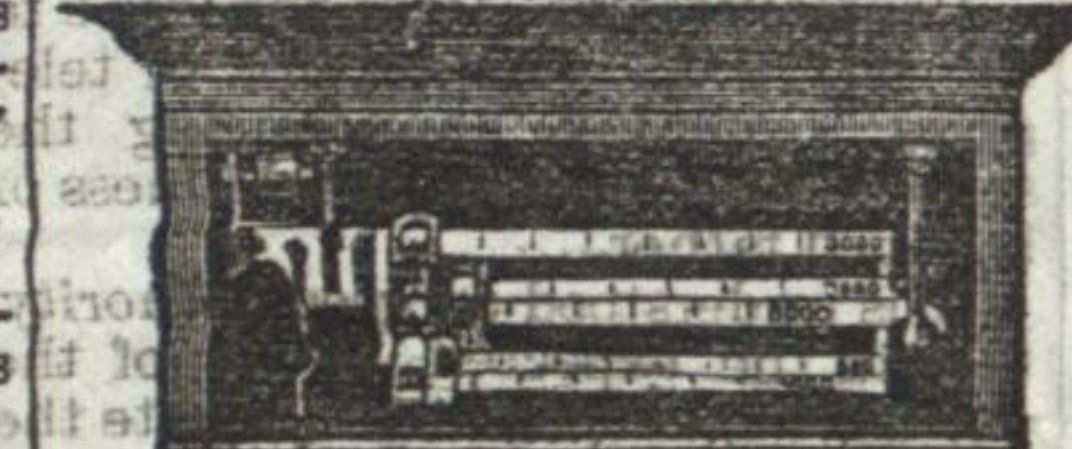
