

## NEWS OF THE WEST.

### Woman and Three Children Found Starving.

AN EXPRESSIVE COURT RECORD.

Nine-year-old Boy Crushed by a Train—Faster Gate a Fatal Fall.

Senator Joseph M. Allen, of Nevada, has just returned from a tour of inspection of the Southern Pacific railway, in which he visited the route of a proposed new line from Los Angeles to the headwaters of the Colorado.

Judge Owen rendered a decision in the case of William Jackson against the Southern Pacific railway, in which he granted the right of a new line to the headwaters of the Colorado, and a right of right-of-way over the line of the Southern Pacific to the headwaters.

Edward Kimmner, a painter, in the employ of St. P. Railway, fell into a hole in a building under way at Woodland, Cal., and was seriously injured internally, fracturing a blood vessel in the lungs. Kimmner is a resident of Waverley, and has a wife and family.

Between 1,500 and 1,800 cords of wood, six cars and two hundred cords were burned at Heppner, Cal., Monday afternoon. The wood was estimated to have been worth \$4,500 to \$5,000. The cars were worth \$200 each, making the loss to the Union Pacific company about \$5,000. Trains are supposed to have started the fire.

Mark Brown, a witness in a case in Justice Carroll's court in San Francisco Monday afternoon, became interested at the court and made an appeal on the latter. Brown grabbed the judge and was about to throw him out of the court room, but was prevented by the arrival of a bailiff, who lodged Brown in prison.

The United States Senator Oscar Pierson, of Minnesota, died at Pacific Beach, near San Diego, Cal., Monday, of pneumonia. He was 61 years old and had been in California for several years. He was a member of the United States Senate from 1885 to 1891.

Another victim has been claimed at "Death's" door, as the sailors are calling it at the foot of 4th street, Oakland, Cal. In known, Larry Moore, aged 9 years, is the victim. Larry, in company with a system of boys, was watching the overhead train just before noon Monday, as it approached the beach street station. They were in the Berkeley track, and the overhead wire made so much noise that they did not hear the Berkeley train coming behind them. As the train passed, it struck the younger boy, caught sight of it and sprang from the track, but not before Larry had been caught and hurled some distance from the spot. The boy was dead when picked up.

Upon motion of United States Attorney Fiske the famous suit of the Interstate Commerce Commission against the Atlantic Coast Line and other railroads was called on for trial in the court here for years, was called on Monday at San Francisco. Recently the United States Supreme court decided in a similar case, so that there was no further need of perfecting the appeal which had been prepared in this case. Clerk Mendenhall of the United States Circuit Court at San Francisco has the record of the case up to date. It is contained in ten large volumes, numbering in all about 5,000 pages. While the suit is pending, the case is being given. Had the appeal been perfected the printing of the record would have cost something like \$2,000. That is about the amount of money to dispute in the suit.

One of the most pitiful cases that has come under the notice of the police and city charities in San Francisco for many a long day was reported Monday at the police station. Mrs. Duncan Campbell, a middle-aged woman of respectable appearance but with great features and bright eyes, went to the station with her three children, the eldest a boy of four years. All the children were thin and faded. The boy was crying for food and the two babies helplessly whimpering. All had been without food for two days. Mrs. Campbell told Sergeant Hurling that unless the children had food at once they would die. Mrs. Campbell has had a sorrowful life. Five years ago she married Duncan Campbell, a longshoreman. He acquired her and later the children also. He was no inveterate drinker, and though he had steady work, seldom took any of his money home. He expected her to find food for herself and babies, and when there was nothing to eat he beat his wife. Three months ago he left her altogether. The wife was turned out because she could not pay her rent. She sold her furniture and went to California, where she was promised work for a year. But the suit was frustrated, the work did not materialize, and she had to return to San Francisco poorer. In her present condition, she has been coming nearer to starvation every day. Mrs. Campbell lives with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. Kemp, in a dirty, ugly basement at 125 William street. The parents are as destitute as the daughter. They are quite old. The father is bedridden and the mother is ill. They are slowly starving to death. The case was reported to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, but the mother, in view of her wretched predicament, did not want to give up her babies. The case has been reported to the Associated Charities, which will look after the whole family, old people, young people and all. Meanwhile the police will look up Longshoreman Campbell. He has been noted for the thousands of associates of the giant children and the haggard grandparents. The mother is willing to work at anything, and so some of food has been put at her disposal with positive suggestion.
