Arriving at Evanston, I was kindly received and entertained by Bishop Wm. G. Burton and family, tarried with them over Sunday, 21st inst., and in the afternoon and evening, spoke to the Saints of Alma and Evanston. Bishop Burton of Evanston, and Bishop J. Brown of Alma, are fully imbued with the spirit of Zion, and are true shepherds to their respective flocks. The Saints under their watchcare are feeling well in the great latter-day work.

While I have endeavored in my weakness to administer the word of life to Saints and strangers in different places where I have labored, the people in return have cheerfully fed, clothed and sheltered me, and have also given me money to bear my expenses from point to point, and I can truly say that through the blessings of God my way has been opened up far beyond my most sanguine expectations, and all my necessities have been supplied. On the morning of the 24th, at Evanston, I joined a company of our emigrants from Europe, and traveled in company with them to Ogden, and the following day I arrived in this city, after an absence from home of a little over two and one half years. I have enjoyed my mission very much, and feel very thankful to have the privilege of once more breathing my own pure mountain air, and enjoying the society of family and friends.
