BULLOCK STRIKE TO MAKE SHIPPER

Bullock Vein Produces Ore That Will be Sent to the Smelter.

EUREKA LILLY FINDS CAVE.

Eagle and Blue Bell to Push Drift Into King William Property—Tintic News.

Among the interesting developments of the Tintic district this week is another strike on the Bullock property and the promise that this property will again be making shipments to the Tin-tic smelter. Manager Benjamin R. Bullock declares that arrangements are now being made with the smelter for the treatment of the ore which was struck yesterday in the drift off the 210-foot level of the property.

The night shift Wednesday broke into the ore just before going off shift and yesterday the drift was pushed through the Bullock vein which was encountered. The ore taken out is described to be a rich copper sulphide and has a shipping quality. The vein is 2 feet thick and was struck in the west drift, 100 feet from the shaft. This drift will also be sent on to catch the big railroad vein which is 15 feet further away. In the old workings this vein was about three feet wide, but was not as rich as the Bullock vein.

The catching of the Bullock vein now opens up three veins in the property. The first two encountered are two feet and one foot wide, and contain good ore, which after sorting can be shipped. The Bullock property has great facilities for shipping as any in the district. The Salt Lake Route tracks come up to the ore bins, so that there will be no trouble in getting the ore to the smelter. From the old workings in the property seven cars of ore were shipped and Manager Bullock declares that he is confident that there is plenty of ore in the property.

The Bullock property and work is being pushed in a manner that promises some good development work there this summer.

OPEN THREE VEINS.

The encountering of the three veins of ore on the 210-foot level proves that the body is continuous to the surface, and that it extends for a great distance through the property. With systematic mining there is excellent opportunity for the mine being one of the producers of the district.

At the Eureka Lilly property, which is in the same district, a cave was encountered on the 300-foot level, and also on the 200-foot level. The cave was first struck Wednesday night on the 300-foot level at a place almost directly beneath the point on which it was encountered on the 200-foot level.

The cave as yet has not been fully explored as the two openings to the direct connection there will not allow a light to penetrate in the opening. This is looked upon as a good indication of ore in sight on this property, as it is in line with the East Tintic Development, where the cave formation brought good ore, and the McKinley, where a good cave was also found.

Superintendent W. M. Owen of the Eagle and Blue Bell property has received instructions to make a return to work on the 1,400 foot level and push the drift into the King William property. To reach the King William ground it will require about 250 feet of work and will take about 60 days. As soon as the objective point is reached a raise will be made from the 1,900 foot level of the King William to the 1,400 level.

WORK ON IRON HAT.

The Iron Hat mining company has let a contract to sink 100 feet, to Fred Wahlberg and Conrad Anderson, and operations were commenced Wednesday. A number of mining men who have visited the property declare that ore will be encountered on the property as soon as the work gets below the iron blotout. A meeting of the directors was held at Robinson Tuesday at which the plans for the future of the company were laid out.

The Iron King Mining company has applied for a patent on a number of its claims situated in the east Tintic section.

A. G. Youngman has accepted the position of master mechanic at the Gemini mine, vice T. B. Sullivan, resigned, who has accepted a similar position with the East Tintic Development company.

Supervisor Ralph Neffing of the East Tintic Development Company reports that he has his machinery in place. He will obtain water from the Beetelmeyer, and will be ready to start the mine up before April 1st.

SLOW DAY FOR STOCKS.

Smaller Securities Hold Sway on the Local Mining Exchange.

Small stocks were the feature of the slow market on the local mining exchange this morning. For several weeks conditions in the east have not been such as to encourage the western operators to continue their work in mining ventures and to hold out hope of the uncertainty of traffic conditions. This morning the smaller stocks were the busiest. They came in to make up the large volume of business, with only a limited amount of money changing hands.

The number of shares of stock sold this morning was 92,696, representing \$6,893.82.

The latest strike in Bullock caused the stock to move up on the board today and 5,000 shares changed hands at 9 cents, buyer 60 days. On the regular board 13,500 shares changed hands.
