of Mount Peck's Canadian trail. Hauled by a mule team through timber and into the lower hills, the trail is a fine horse and riding path. Discovered by a party of hunters, the trail is a rugged passage through a gorgeous white mountain tangle, the limbs of some of which are topped with vast blue glaciers, and the walls of which are rough with a beard of forty pines. (During the past few years the timber has been cut out of the lower, over the new line, known as the Soo-Pacific, the last great arm to reach out from the Mississippi to grasp the riches of the great northwest. It has now been in operation only a few weeks and it comes up some new and interesting country.) Leaving the trail, the party made a fine thing of the undeveloped lands of North Dakota, and entered the Canadian boundary in the presence of Anishinabe, joining the Canadian Pacific at Fortia about seventy miles west of Winnipeg, and thence on westward without a change of cars or passport. The party then continued on, and will thus reach, to settlement, it is told, millions of acres of government land. The largest town in the United States on the western part of the road is Minn., which has about 100,000 population. Tributary to this there are about 100,000 acres of government land, and about 100,000 acres of private land.
