FIRE SCARE AT ELECTRIC.

Moving Picture Films Explode but no Damage Done.

There was quite a scare at the Electric theater, 246 State street about 7:30 last evening when the film started unrolling the bare lines short-circuiting and causing the film to ignite and caused the explosion of a celluloid film in the moving picture machine. Byron Park was operating the machine when he discovered that something was burning. There were about 200 persons in the house at the time. Park notified the employees on the lower floor and they at once stated to the audience that something was wrong, and that they had better leave the house at once. As the audience filed out the film exploded and the box where the machine was operated burst into flames. Park managed to escape without being hurt. A alarm was turned in and the department soon had the blaze extinguished. The loss is estimated at \$300.

BOISE MAN IS DROWNED

While Diving at Sanitarium, W. D. Fields Strikes Floating Barrel, Disabling Him from Swimming.

Boise, Idaho, Feb. 8.—While bathing in the deep plunge at the sanitarium yesterday afternoon, W. D. Fields, a prominent real estate man of this city, was drowned. Fields was reported to be one of the best swimmers in the city. He had been in the plunge with two friends for about an hour, when he retired to his dressing room. In a few minutes he returned to the swimming pool. Diving into the water where it was 12 feet deep, his foot struck a floating barrel, dislocating the member, this producing the shock which caused his drowning.

An attendant soon recovered the body and medical aid was applied, but life was extinct. Deceased leaves a wife and child.
