EXPLANATORY.

The "NEWS," through the want of paper, was compelled to suspend the regular issues of its Semi of Sept. 28 and Oct. 1, and its Weekly of Oct. 2; and that too without, at that time, being able to inform its readers whether such suspension would be necessary, as, from report, a portion of its paper was daily expected.

The arrival of General H. B. Clawson yesterday, as noted elsewhere, enables us to give the following information: All the paper, instead of two-thirds as first reported, that he had purchased for the "NEWS," was burned by Indians in the forepart of August, at the time they ran a freight train off from the track and destroyed its contents in the neighborhood of Plum Creek. It will be readily understood that this unforeseen destruction not only frustrated the well laid plans for a plenty of paper in good time, but necessitated the heavy additional expense of duplicating so large a purchase, and the prolonging of the time of the arrival of the paper beyond the limit of the supply on hand or procurable here at any price, which of course compelled the suspension already mentioned.

Gen. Clawson informs us that our supply of paper will probably reach here in about thirty days, and until it arrives every possible effort will be made to issue the "NEWS" regularly; though, until then, we may be, as we have been, obliged to again suspend for a week or so. To meet the expressed wishes of many, the next Tuesday morning Semi will be kept back until all the Conference minutes are in, which of course will throw the next Wednesday morning Weekly proportionally beyond its regular time, but will enable us to publish all the minutes in one number of each "NEWS," which is thought to be the course most acceptable to its readers.

Of course the past and any subsequent suspension, should unavoidable circumstances compel another, will make no difference in the number of papers each subscriber will receive, for they will be numbered consecutively to the close of each volume, the same as when there is no suspension, the suspension merely prolonging by that much the times in which the current volumes will close.

Since writing the foregoing, the paper purchased by Gen. Clawson for the "NEWS" has arrived, and we trust that the SEMI and WEEKLY will appear with that promptness and regularity which the want of paper alone interrupted.

MILITARY. HEADQUARTERS FIRST DIVISION, Major General's Office, Great Salt Lake City, Oct. 2, 1867. GENERAL ORDERS No 10.

I. Pursuant to Special Orders No. I, from the Lieutenant General Commanding the Nauvoo Legion, there will be a General Muster and Encampment, for the purpose of Drill, Inspection of Arms, etc., of the Militia of Great Salt Lake Military District, at Camp Wasatch, on the west bank of Jordan River, near Great Salt Lake City, on Tuesday, the 29th day of October, inst.

II. Officers in charge of local districts are required to enroll and notify according to the provisions of law, all persons subject to military duty, and will be held responsible for neglect.

III. Officers will have their respective commands properly armed and equipped and supplied with bedding and clothing suitable for the season, rations for three days, cooking utensils, tents, transportation, etc., and on the parade ground by 9 o'clock, a.m. on the day above specified.

III. Measures should be taken to ensure good order and sobriety, and every precaution used to avoid the occurrence of accidents from the careless use of fire arms, negligence, or otherwise during the muster.
