It was raining at the time of report at Winnemucca, Boise, Spokane, and Portland. The temperature changes were unimportant except a rise of 10 degrees to 22 degrees over portions of Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, and the central Canadian provinces; and a fall of 10 degrees to 14 degrees over the B. N. W. territories.
