





He also helds that there is nothing in the law prohibiting the department from setting aside for the temporary use of such societies the temporary use of such societies or Organizations, not to exceed 160 acres on Indian reservations for the purpose specified, though they may not have been in occupancy of the land at the date of the passage of the act. This occupancy, however, is made subject to the pleasure of the department.
