President Antonio Zucca declared that Huly's exports to the United States had increased \$6,000,000.

He strongly urged the enactment of a broad treaty of reciprocity between this country and Italy, and said the measure before a committee of the schate calculated to check Italian imnigration would work a serious injury to this country where Italians were the largest factor in rallway and othes construction work.
