DOUBOIS FAILING AT EVERY TURN

From All Parts of Idaho His Defeat Is Forecasted in Sentiment.

RELIES ON HIS "AMERICANS."

If Beaten by Legitimate Means, He Will Hold Fast to His Weak Following to Foist New Program.

Boise, Idaho, April 6.—The attempt of the little coterie following the forlorn lead of Mr. Dubois to stem the tide that threatens absolutely to overwhelm his rabid anti-Mormon crusade through the Democratic party of Idaho is meeting with such flat and signal failure as to prompt a sincere prayer for the lack of judgment exercised by him and his followers.

The Democratic provisional committee of this city receives daily mail letters from nearly every county in the state, setting forth the revolt of the sincere Democrats against the Dubois folly.

One of the distinguished professors of the state university at Moscow, in a recent address at the Idaho Anti-Mormon convention, said a solid delegation to Twin Falls to overthrow the Dubois anti-Mormon program. Similar news comes from Idaho county also.

McCLURE'S POSITION. State Senator McClure of Kootenai county, one of the most eloquent and forceful members of the last legislature, has been elected to the position of the nomination of some high position in the party, is squarely with the Democrats who favor making Bryan and national issues paramount in this campaign.

Every indication now points to the overwhelming defeat of the anti-Mormon proposition in the Twin Falls convention to start with, and when it comes to the convention to nominate the state officers, it is confidently asserted that the opposition will have petered out entirely.

The announcement of Mr. Arney business manager of Dubois' sheet, the Scimitar, as published in the Salt Lake Tribune of April 1, that a strong W. J. Bryan Democratic club was organized in this city, is the laughing stock of everybody who knows anything at all of the situation here. After raking the entire country they have succeeded in mustering 37 names, who are the salt of the earth.

IN THE MINORITY. They are hopelessly in the minority here and Mr. Dubois will carry but very few counties in the state. His proposition will be turned down cold.

His farcical attempt to pose as a great friend of W. J. Bryan is so silly as to excite nothing but ridicule, wherever his past conduct and attitude toward Mr. Bryan are known. Notwithstanding the fact that the Scimitar, which Mr. Dubois was down and out in the state of Idaho, went out of his way and made a personal effort among Democrats to secure his election to the United States senate after Mr. Bryan was defeated in 1900 and Mr. Dubois was senator from this state, largely through the efforts of Mr. Bryan, he turned the cold shoulder to that distinguished and peerless leader, proclaimed to all and sundry that he was a back number, and joined hands with the Democratic contingent in Congress in support of Judge Parker for the nomination for the presidency, in direct opposition to the wishes of Mr. Bryan.

DUBOIS LOST IN 1904. And when, at the Weber convention in 1904, the nearest interests manifested a special control of the convention and Mr. Dubois was practically forced to come into camp, and he went as a delegate to the national convention, he was instructed to support Mr. Hearst, he took advantage of his position as head of the Democratic delegation to change the vote of the delegation from Hearst to Parker, before the vote was counted, thus proving recalcitrant to the trust reposed in him by the Democrats of Idaho, and causing Senator Hearst to lose the Senate seat which he had won.

All this time such men as John Nugent, Carl Paine, Judge Perky, and others who are now characterized in Mr. Dubois' paper as Jack Mormons, free-booters and bad men generally, were standing firmly by Mr. Bryan and his policies, and are standing by him to this day.

In addition to this, Mr. Dubois, who controlled absolutely the Democratic state chairman in the campaign of 1904, pushed the anti-Mormon issue from front to back, completely as to exclude the discussion of national issues, and Judge Parker, the Democratic nominee with Bryan for the presidency, has not said anything, and hands the cold respect of a passing glance, and that is the kind of political hairpin the ex-senator is.

THE DUBOIS PROGRAM. And should his present absolute dominance and control of the Democratic party of Idaho be continued, and his rabid anti-Mormon program again foisted on the party, we will have in Idaho once more a repetition of the campaign of 1904, and Mr. Bryan and national issues will be allowed to sink to oblivion.

The Democrats of Idaho are at last waking up to this condition and if Mr. Dubois expects to drill with the Democrats this fall, he will come off his nature as to the anti-Mormon issue, and submit to the will of the majority.

His sheet-anchor, of course, is the forlorn hope of the "American" party and if the threats of his mouthpieces to shatter the benefits of his discovery, that the anti-Mormon issue will have in Idaho once more a repetition of the campaign of 1904, and Mr. Bryan and national issues will be allowed to sink to oblivion.
