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ACCIDENT.—A severe accident has occurred on the steamer, recently launched, the City of Cheyenne, of which the Corinne Daily Journal of Saturday gives the following account:

On Saturday afternoon, a little after five o'clock, the steamer City of Cheyenne, which has been placed in position, a derick holding down, with a crash, striking and precipitating Capt. Evans from the hurricane to the main deck. The damage to the steamer was the fault of Capt. Evans himself. While Mr. Dickson and Capt. Howe were at dinner, the derick, which was supporting the smokestacks, in order that he might lower it, without for a moment considering the result. As a natural consequence they fell as stated. Capt. Evans, who is a man of about fifty years of age, received a fracture of the left arm at the elbow joint, a severe sprain of the right wrist, a very bad cut over the left eye, and other general injuries. Dr. Graham informs us that his injuries will most likely permanently disable him, especially the left arm, as a fracture extending into the joint is rarely, if ever, perfectly repaired. The damage to the steamer was slight, but will occasion some delay.


