NEWS OF THE DAY.

Bishop Colenso is forbidden to preach in the diocese of London.

Two men were shot last night at Fort Belvoir, one of whom, while dying, declared that the other knew all about the child Charley Ross, stolen at Philadelphia.

The steamship August Andre went ashore last night; the passengers were saved. The steamer Mongol wrecked; sixteen persons drowned.

Latest dispatches from South America show that the relations between several of the Spanish American Republics are not very satisfactory.

A shocking calamity happened at Preakness, N. J., yesterday, an entire family of five children being drowned by falling through the ice.

The European Jetty system is pronounced impracticable for improving the mouth of the Mississippi.

It is said that unless Congress orders a comprehensive system for the improvement of the levees of the Mississippi, the inhabitants are liable to be thoroughly impoverished by floods.

Jay Gould will ask congressional aid for a new steamship line from San Francisco to China.

The friends of the Texas Pacific are vigorously canvassing congressmen in favor of that road, and it is said, are meeting with great encouragement.

Small towns in Michigan issued bonds in aid of railroads, but the State supreme court decided that the law under which such bonds were issued was unconstitutional, rendering the bonds liable to the U. S. government.

A bill introduced in the House pronounced a perfect success. The road is graded continuously round the point and onward, for eight and a half miles, which is ready for the ties and rails. It is anticipated that the track will be laid as far as Clinton's, nearly twenty miles in all, soon after the New Year, say about Jan. 10, the remainder of the route to Stockton to be pushed through at a rate of one o'clock.

Another party left the depot about half past ten a.m. The early morning was somewhat foggy, but it soon cleared up and became fine, bright, and beautiful. The cars ran with remarkable smoothness, considering that along the greater part of the way, the road was not ballasted.

In about three-quarters of an hour the prairie was crossed, and the train arrived at the end of the track, when the company alighted and most of the gentlemen and ladies walked a few hundred yards further along the grade and back. Soon after twelve the train started on the return to the city, having made about one o'clock.

Another party went out today, and henceforth regular trains for passenger and freight will run daily.

The summettes of snow on the prairie, as far as the track goes, is rather redeemed by the "breath of real air" which one gets by going over there, as one finds oneself in the salinity of the ocean.

General Cyrus of N. Y. has been bailed in \$15,000.

A bill was introduced in the popular branch of the national legislature, this morning, to reduce letter postage to one cent.

A bill passed the U. S. Senate this morning, to relieve settlers on the public lands, who have been compelled to vacate their homes, on account of the grasshopper ravages.

The Longshoremen's Association at Hoboken, on account of quarrels growing out of the strike, has dismissed.

W. C. Hopping has been nominated by President Grant, for postmaster at Sacramento, Cal.

UTAH WESTERN RAILWAY.

The Utah Western Railway, as the company is at present organized, is intended to run between this City and Stockton, 45 miles. It's narrow, or three feet, gauge. The line commences at the south-west corner of the Depot in this City, runs down South Temple Street, across the Jordan about a quarter of a mile south of the North Temple Street bridge, and then over the prairie westward to Chambers' stage station, at the foot of the West or Quartz Mountain, and a mile or so south of the Point, continuing on to and around the Point, by Black Rock, into Tooele Valley.

Yesterday 104 gentlemen and ladies, by invitation, stepped into the Utah Western cars at the Depot, and enjoyed a very pleasant trip to the end of the track, a distance of 11 miles, or to within a mile of Chambers' stage station, and back.
