LINEMAN MEETS SHOCKING DEATH

William Lacey, an Employee of Utah Light & Power Co. Electrocuted.

YOUNG BRIDE WANTS DIVORCE.

Mrs. Hattie B. Lloyd, Aged 15, Claims Husband Deserted Her—Court Business.

Ogden, July 13.—William Lacey, a lineman in the employ of the Utah Light & Power Co., met almost instant death about 4:45 yesterday afternoon by accidentally taking hold of a live wire. He, with a number of other linemen, was working on the Washington avenue line near Sixteenth street. Mr. Lacey was on one of the poles tying up the wires, and was just putting the last tie on when his left arm just above his glove touched a wire, and at the same moment his right hand, which was covered with a glove all excepting a small place where a hole had been worn, touched another wire, causing a circuit which fell upon the wires, which badly burned his left arm and hand. Foreman E. S. Jones was near by and climbed the pole and assisted in letting the almost lifeless form down. Dr. Osgood was summoned, but when he arrived the unfortunate man had just passed away. Lacey is a young man about 28 years of age and has a young wife to whom he was only recently married, living at 229 Twenty-third street. He has been in the employ of the Utah Light & Power Co. only about two months, but was formerly employed as a lineman by the Utah Independent Telephone Co. Arrangements for the funeral are being made and will be announced later.

DISTRICT COURT BUSINESS.

Bride of 15 Deserted After 8 Months Of Marriage.

Two divorce suits have been filed in the Second district court. Hattie B. Lloyd, who according to the allegations of the complaint, is but 15 years of age and was only married at Ogden last November 13, to Wm. L. Lloyd, wants a divorce from her husband, whom she charges has been cruel to her and has recently deserted her and gone to his parents to live in Iowa. She wants a decree of divorce, alimony of \$20 per month, \$50 attorney's fees and restoration of her maiden name, Hattie V. Welling.

Mrs. Rosina E. Sanford has commenced divorce proceedings against Samuel Sanford. The complaint charges that they were married at Salt Lake City, August 24, 1905. That defendant has been cruel to her. She prays for a divorce, alimony and a decree of the court dividing the property of defendant between them.

Joseph Smith and James Surridge have filed a suit in the district court against C. C. Wansgaard, Slater Irrigation company and others to recover \$100 damages and for a permanent restraining order preventing defendants from using certain irrigation ditches which they claim are on land belonging to plaintiffs. They also ask for a decree of the court quieting the title.

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL OUTING.

Annual Picnic in South Fork Canyon For State Institution.

Ogden, July 13.—Capt. W. Kneass and Officer Thomas Meyers with 11 of the older boys from the State Industrial school, left yesterday afternoon for South Fork canyon to pitch tents and prepare camp for the inmates of the institution who next Saturday

will start on their march from the school to the camping grounds, a distance of over 20 miles from Ogden. On their arrival at the canyon all of the inmates will be placed on their merits and under military discipline, on a 10 days' camp life. This is an annual outing for the boys and girls which does them a great amount of good, and places them for that length of time on their good behavior.

CAUSE OF OGDEN'S DARKNESS.

Ogden was in darkness last evening for about 20 minutes caused by a short circuit of the line between Ogden and Salt Lake City. The short circuit caused a small fire, which resulted in one of the large transformers at the powerhouse being burned out, and put out of commission. Several men were immediately put to work and made the repairs necessary and the lights were again turned on.

SPRAINED HIS ARM.

The 12-year-old son of Fred Jude, who lives on Thirty-second street and Wall avenue, while on roller skates at the Lagoon yesterday afternoon, with several playmates, was severely hurt. One of his companions caught him by the coat and pulled him over. He fell on his right arm causing a bad sprain of the wrist. At first it was thought his arm was broken and a physician was called who found that it was painfully sprained.

Mental Hospital Affairs—Departments Inspected and Found Satisfactory.

Provo, July 13.—The state board of insanity met here yesterday in regular monthly session, all the members being present. The following appropriations were made: Salaries, \$1,922; current expenses, \$1,738.31. Treasurer Farrer reported the following amounts on hand in the several funds: General fund, \$1,265.65; improvements and repairs, \$432.

EDWIN ASTON DEAD.

Edwin Aston died in the state mental hospital yesterday from an attack of apoplexy while going along the hall to his room. His death was unexpected at this time as he was apparently in good physical condition. The deceased was 44 years of age and has been a patient since April 26, 1900. His remains will

be taken to London, where his family resides.

FOURTH DISTRICT COURT.

Yesterday in the Fourth district court William Myers was sentenced to four months in the county jail, after Judge Booth had overruled a motion for a new trial made by defendant's attorney.

The district attorney was instructed to bring suit against the bondsmen of Elnors Ajax, whose bonds have been declared forfeited.

H. F. Thomas was appointed commissioner to distribute the waters of Provo river for 1906.

COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY.

There was a large attendance at the meeting of the Utah County Medical society, held yesterday in the Commercial club rooms. President Steele presiding. The committee, appointed at the previous meeting to investigate the matter of memberships of physicians not residing in the county, reported that under the constitution and by-laws, all

properly qualified physicians are eligible to membership.

A copy of a medical fee bill was presented by the committee appointed to revise the present fee bill. The new schedule of charges for professional services will be considered in the August meeting, and a paper on "Medical Ethics" will be presented by Dr. Stookey.

Mary Hemingway Healy, whose funeral services took place at Alpine, July 8, was a daughter of Thomas and Martha Leveson Hemingway, and was born at Todd's Hollow, Nottinghamshire, Eng., Oct. 2, 1820.

She was baptized a member of the Church June 8, 1845, and was married to John Healy at Crosby Church, Nottinghamshire, Eng., June 2, 1847. In 1852 with four children, she emigrated to Zion, her husband following her year later.
