suits Being Ootmied. Things in general seem to be mov-ing along in a pretty satisfactory manner to the management on the big territory belonging to the Tintic Silver Crown Mining company, out in West Tintic. Assays this week from rock sent in from two claims that hereto-fore had not been put to the acid test by the company showed values do-cidedly gratifying. Samples from a 20-foot hole on Silver Colorado No. 1 showed lead 56.3 per cent; silver 18.6 ounces; gold, 80 cents, which makes it worth \$62 to the ton. The other ore was from Silver Star, where work is now being pushed. The ore taken from three places assayed as follows; lead 65 per cent; silver 29.8 ounces; gold \$1.20, a total valuation of \$76 tq the ton. The management has had rock assayed from 12 of its 25 claims, all showing values of about \$20 up to nearly \$90 to the ton, and much of this was practically surface rock. They anticipate that a little depth on some of these best outcrops will break into big rich bodies. Mond.v, J. A. Ed-wards, president of the company, ex-pects to go out to look after some in-terests connected with the property.
