TELEGRAPH ACROSS THE ATLAN-TIC .- A plan has been matured to connect New York and Liverpool by means of electric wires. S. T. Armstrong, of the Hudson (Gutta Percha) Manufactory, proposes to contract to lay down a line of coated impregnable and perfectly insulated wire cable, that shall be capable of continued action for ten years, and to be completed in twenty months from the date of contract. He proposes, also, to lay a similar line from some points on the Mississippi river to the Pacific, on the same terms, to be guaranteed by any bonds that may be required. This scheme has the sanction of Professor Morse, and will be laid before Congress at an early day.
