SPRINGVILLE, Nov. 27, 1873.  
Editor Deseret News:

The Board of Directors and Stockholders of Springville Co-operative Institution met at the new Relief Store, just erected, the object of the meeting being the dedication of their new building.

This building is 30 x 45 feet, consisting of two stories and having a substantial cellar. It contains seven rooms besides the basement. One of the upper rooms is 20 x 45 feet, and is designed for the use of the Relief Society, for lectures and occasional dancing. This room is handsomely furnished. The room to be used as a store is 24 x 42 feet. The entire building reflects great credit on the perseverance and ability of the President and Board of Directors. This is the second store erected in Springville by this company, during the last two years, and is an evidence of what can be done in a short time, by unity of plan and purpose. The dedicatory services opened with prayer and singing. Brief addresses were offered by the President, Bp. Bringhurst, by Vice President W. H. Kelsey, Directors T. Chase and L. S. Wood, and Secretary C. D. Evans, Aaron Johnson, sen., and F. C. Boyer, one of the clerks, who each discoursed on the benefits of the great co-operative measure, and on the necessity of extending the business so as to include other branches of trade and manufacture. The dedicatory prayer was offered by Bp. Bringhurst. A happy spirit seemed to prevail and the people were dismissed with feelings of renewed determination to sustain the co-operative cause.

**PICHE NOTES.**

From the Record of Nov. 20—

At a killing match, Nov. 17, at Wines & Montgomery's slaughter house, between Lannan and Too-mey, on a bet of \$150, the former winning; he dressing his bullock in eight minutes and eleven seconds, beating his opponent fifteen seconds.

Here in Pioche we have not merely one mine disbursing \$15,000 or \$20,000, but, according to an official statement published yesterday there are sixteen mines which give a gross yield of \$907,987 for the quarter ending September 30. This is an average of \$302,662 a month. Precisely how much of this amount is disbursed here in the shape of miners' wages, tools, supplies, etc., we are not prepared to say. It would be extravagant to assert that it was three-fourths, but if it were, then there must be disbursed in this camp nearly \$227,000 every month. But we will not go so far as that; we will put the amount disbursed at one-half, which would give an amount exceeding \$151,000 monthly.
