

## TELEGRAPHIC. STENHOUSE IN JAIL.

A Son of the Author Charged with Grand Larceny

### HIS SON IS THE COMPLAINANT.

Says His Father Sold the Furniture and Eloped with a Nanny Widow.

**SAN FRANCISCO,** July 9.—Lorenzo Stenhouse, son of T. H. H. Stenhouse, well-known in early days as an author, lecturer and reformer is in jail on a charge of grand larceny. He came under suspicion from Miss Lois, wife of his son, Lorenzo, who says his father left the family, sold without authority furniture and jewelry belonging to his wife, eloped with a Miss Mary Dowd, Miss Virginia Egan, with whom he went to Los Angeles, San Diego and Riverside.

### DIED IN JAIL.

An American Citizen Killed by Turks in Istanbul.

**NEW YORK,** July 9.—An American gentleman just returned from the Orient brings information of the arrest and death of an American citizen there. The man was made without a warrant and death, induced by the Turkish officials, occurred within a Turkish prison.

The victim was J. W. West, who passed most of his time at the United States Consulate in Constantinople. At the time of his arrest he was on a rail way train at Edirne. Having failed to make himself understood, the local officials refused to discharge his passport.

The prisoner was forced to walk from Edirne to Istanbul five days journey, becoming very ill. At Edirne he was sent into jail and in a few hours died.

### BULL FIGHT IN COLORADO.

The First One Ever Arranged for in the United States.

**CHEYENNE, Colo.**, July 9.—Arrangements are being made for the holding of a carnival of sports, of which a genuine bull fight will be the principal attraction. The bull will be imported from the fairs in the Criollo Cigar district, and while no date has yet been announced, it will occur early in the fall.

The bull fight will be conducted in the same way as in the city of Cheyenne, and the first one ever arranged in the Mexican capital, have been engaged to conduct the affair. A new hotel in Cheyenne has been constructed, and seats for 10,000 persons are now being erected.

A wild bull show will be another feature. This will be the first bull fight ever witnessed in the United States. While the authorities state that they will prevent the affair, the management is confident that the law can be forgotten until the fight is ended.

### Westbound Mail Reduced.

**OMAHA,** July 8.—Effective July 10, the Union Pacific will reduce westbound freight rates from the Missouri River Mountains and Idaho mountains entire, and from the eastern part of the country in lesser towns than elsewhere with Missouri river gateways. The result will be given out to-night, and it is expected to provide a big raw. The cut will prove especially effective, for the Union Pacific will effect its influence on the traffic of the Union Pacific. It is believed that their position could not be considered certain until rates in the whole northwest had been fixed by their railroad, and they had brought down to a common level, and they are in control of the tariff. However, the Union Pacific had been maintaining higher rates to Oregon and Montana than to intermediate points, and it was the purpose of making all rates equal, officials commented, that the changes were agreed upon.

### MONTANA SCHOOL QUESTION.

**Montana Cabinet Ministers Will Resign Perhaps.**

**OTTAWA,** July 8.—A ministerial crisis developed in the Dominion Parliament over the Manitoba school question. Rumors of the resignation of Mr. Quinlan, minister of public works, Philip Gowan, postmaster general, and H. M. Macgillivray of agriculture, six bills, circulate. These three are the only French Canadian in the cabinet.

This afternoon in the House of Commons, Wilfrid Laurier, leader of the liberals, moved, as a resolution of want of confidence, the adjournment of the house. In the senate Mr. Mackenzie Mowat had had nothing to say toward the rumored resignation. It is rumoured that Mr. Quinlan, Gowan and Gowan will consider their decision and will withdraw their resignations.

### Silver Export.

**NEW YORK,** July 8.—The steamship Paris will take tomorrow 450,000 dollars of silver.

### BIMETALLISM ABROAD.

**French and German Agree to an International Convention.**

**NEW YORK,** July 9.—A committee of the World gold-Pt. assay and assayists has been formed to negotiate a general international convention of coinage rights, and with the Germans signed the French proposal, which provides for the convening of an international coinage conference, which will fix the relationship of the two metals.

The international congress closed to-day. The general feeling among American delegates was that much valuable time had been wasted in banquets and receptions which might have been better employed. France has accepted the invitation of the international arbitration. Her alliance with Russia is now a recognized fact.

The river is still steadily rising, and it goes six inches higher a hundred people will be forced to leave their homes. Between midnight and daybreak this morning the water at the head of three farms is lower, but since that time the river has not been so fast.
