Goldfield Engineer Visits Principal Mines of Copper District.

Wallace Macgregor, engineer for the Nevada Goldfield Reduction company, has just returned from Yerington after being there 20 days, says the Goldfield News

He has charge of a development there for his people. During his stay he went through the main mines of the district and says that the late developments made in five of the properties of the district establish the Yerington or Mason Valley district as one of the best in the state and it will take place as one of the great copper producers of west.

as one of the great copper producers of the west. An immense tonnage of both oxidized and sulphide ore has been developed on the Ludwig and Douglas properties on the Smith valley side of the range, while on the east, or Mason Valley side the Bluestone. Mason Valley and West-ern Nevada mines have developed very large bodies of sulphide of copper ore, mainly as chalcopyrite. Across Mason valley and to the east 22 miles is a new copper development called the Northern Light, which has developed some good copper sulphide ore at depth of 150 feet under very strong outcrop. The Mason valley or Yerington dis-trict, is one of the most favorable loca-tions in the west for mining operations. The Walker river runs through the val-ley and not three miles below most of the mines located to the west in the range of hills. Mason valley is some 25 or 30 miles long by four to six miles wide, and is one of the most fer-tile and vel watered valleys of the state and raises all necessary produce needed in mine operation. The Truckee River General Electric company has brought in electric cur-rent and each operating mine has in-stalled motors to operate hoists and compressors. Each of the large prop-extics is using machine drills. The ore bodies are so large that when act-ual extraction begins to furnish ore small as any place in the state or in
