

ARMY MOVES UPON REBELS.

Troops Progress for More Than Two Miles Without Encountering Enemy.

UTAH GUNS AGAIN IN ACTION.

New York, March 29.—A dispatch to the Herald from Manila, Wednesday.

As it is known that the insurgents are endeavoring to ambush the troops, who drive them back with the loss of several killed and more than twenty wounded—troops getting ready for the assault.

At 5 o'clock this Wednesday morning the fighting resumed, with the Third and Fourth regiments and the 10th and 11th regiments on the left of the railroad and the 12th and 13th regiments on the right.
