WHEREAS.

Whereas, Certain measures were pending before the last Congress of the United States, which proposed an appropriation to be distributed among the several States in aid of popular education; and

Whereas, The measure provides that this distribution shall be made for a term of years upon the basis of the population; and

Whereas, The measure proposed to do not claim for the Federal Government the right to control education in the States, but provides simply for handing over the amount appropriated to the constituted authorities of the States; and

Resolved, That this convention most heartily approves the adoption of some measure of national legislation which shall embody the principles set forth in the foregoing preamble.

Discussion of the subject of Federal aid to education was then opened by the Hon. Charles F. Smith, of Iowa, agent of the Peabody trust, who in a speech of an hour's length, held the convention's closest attention.
