A SYNTHESIS OF ALL HERESY.

Leads to Atheism—Clergy and Faithful Not to be Allowed to Read Modernist Books

Religious Congresses, Except on Rare Occasions, Prohibited—Councils in Each Diocese.

Denial of the clergy and faithful are not to be allowed to read modernist publications.

A committee of censorship is to be established in every diocese, to pass upon the publications which clergy and faithful shall be permitted to read.

The encyclical of the late Pope Leo XIII, prohibiting the clergy from teaching modernist theories, and forbidding their bishops' permission and approval for supervision of the work of ecclesiastical writers, is confirmed.

Religious congresses, except on rare occasions, are prohibited.

A council is to be constituted in every diocese to combat modern errors.
