

TALK OF THE TOWN.

The Tabernacle choir practices to-night. Counterfeit \$2.50 gold pieces are in circulation. Nothing doing in the police court this morning. The Lake bathing trains are still well patronized.

Crops in Bear Lake have been badly damaged by frost. Remember the conventions at the Court House to-morrow. H. S. Gowans, Esq., Probate Judge of Tooele County, is in the city.

Grading in Jefferson Canyon, on the Utah and Northern, is in progress. The Supreme Court convenes to-morrow, when it is expected it will wind up its business. The sidewalk a little east of the depot is in a fearfully dilapidated condition.

Mr. David G. Calder and Miss Sarah E. Hagar, of this city, were married last evening. The celebration in Ogden, on Monday, will be a joint commemoration of the 4th and 24th of July.

The case of Wm. K. Nye vs. Conner, Kirk & Co., has been decided. Judgment for plaintiff. In the case of Henry Collins vs. George Pearson, default and judgment for the plaintiff have been entered.

David P. Rich, son of Apostle Charles C. Rich, has just returned from Bear Lake. He says his father is very feeble, and contemplates sailing again to Salt Lake. Manager W. W. Ritter, of the Utah and Nevada Railway, will run special sailing trains on Monday next, to accommodate all who intend to celebrate the 24th.

According to the new time table on the Utah Central Railway, visitors from the south can come and return the same day, arriving at 10 a.m., and returning at 2 p.m. O. S. Walsh, Esq., a prominent merchant of Wolverhampton, England, and a town councillor of the same place, has arrived in Salt Lake. He intends to make his home in Utah.

The Sanpete County Convention has resulted in the nomination of A. K. Thurber for Councilor, and Captain Peterson and Henry Beal for representatives to the Legislative Assembly. Walker Brothers and other stores are willing to do so, but are waiting on the rest.

LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

Passed Away.—It is with deep regret that we learn of the death, on the 21st inst., of Sister Emma F. Savage, wife of our esteemed friend and brother, Elder G. R. Savage. The deceased has been a sufferer for a long time, and after a lingering illness has gone where pain and sickness can afflict no more. She was an excellent woman in every respect, and will be mourned by a host of sincere and loving friends, with whom we deeply sympathize with the bereaved husband and household. The funeral services will be held in the Court House, on Saturday, at 10 a.m., to which the friends of the family are invited.

False Imprisonment.—On the 5th of September, 1878, F. W. Duncome, a young man, engaged in mining in southern Utah, was accused by Campbell, Cullen & Co., of the German Leaching Works, at Frisco, of stealing from their premises 100 pounds of sulphides, valued at \$700. He was arrested and tried in the Second District Court, then presided over by Associate Justice J. S. Boreman, and on the 17th of that month was convicted of grand larceny and sentenced to three years imprisonment in the Utah Penitentiary. At the trial, he strongly asserted his innocence, and endeavored to prove an alibi, declaring that on the night of the alleged robbery June 28, 1878—he was at the Wah Wah Mountains, 35 miles from the locality where it was committed, in company with a number of men, among whom were Patrick Ryan, Thomas Moriarty, Mike Fitzgerald, Dick Smith, Pat Bradley and others. He desired that these men be summoned as witnesses to testify in his behalf. The papers were accordingly issued and served by the U. S. Marshal, but the witnesses all failed to appear. The trial then proceeded, despite the protest of the defendant. Judge Boreman, we are informed, remarking that the presence of the defendant's witnesses was not essential in the case, cleared against the prisoner. The result was his conviction and sentence for the term stated above. The evidence against him was as follows: Duncome had sent by a man named Mickey Free, a hat-full of horn silver to Campbell, Cullen & Co.'s leaching works, where he offered it for sale. The proprietors recognized, as they claimed, in this ore a portion of the stolen sulphides, and accordingly had Duncome arrested as the thief. The latter, having no witnesses, could only produce his own statement in rebuttal, which was to the following effect: The hatful of horn silver had been given to him by a man named Johnny Walker, on the 20th day of May preceding the larceny, and Duncome sent it by Free, some months later, to sell to the proprietors of the leaching works. This statement, unsupported, was not deemed sufficient by the Court, and Judge Boreman, hurried on by Mr. Campbell, who was doubtless anxious to convict somebody of the theft, as a warning to thieves in general, refused to compel the attendance of the defendant's witnesses, who could have proven his alibi, and consequently conviction took place.

About this time, Johnny Walker, who had given the ore to Duncome, and who had started for the Black Hills, hearing of the trial, made an affidavit supporting the defendant's statement in regard to the gift of the ore, and Patrick Bradley, one of the men with whom Duncome was staying on the night of the theft, also made affidavit to prove the prisoner's alibi. These papers were transmitted to Governor Emery, who being busy with matters pertaining to his re-appointment, mislaid them and they were lost. When asked, therefore, to accompany a petition for the pardon of the defendant they were missing, and the affidavits being beyond reach, could not be obtained.

Thus it was, that by a chain of circumstances, Duncome, an innocent man, was consigned to the Penitentiary and served out two years of his term. He was then pardoned by the present Governor, and restored to citizenship, on the recommendation of Judge Boreman, who sentenced him, and A. G. Campbell, senior of the firm that had been robbed. Both of these had become convinced of Duncome's innocence, although the papers which would have proved it conclusively were still unobtainable. Mr. Campbell, on the 27th of last month, made public acknowledgment that he believed Mr. Duncome innocent of the crime. This is substantially the statement made by the latter supported by papers in his possession. He has wrongfully suffered the ignominy of imprisonment with felons for two years, and feels deeply the wrongs committed against him, which might have been averted had Messrs. Boreman and Campbell, who have since done some little in the way of making reparation for the part they took in his conviction, had been less hasty in the first place, and given the helpless prisoner a fair opportunity of establishing his innocence.

Additional reparation is due in our opinion, to the victim of such unfair and injudicious proceedings. We publish this in justice to Mr. Duncome, in order that the public may know the correct status of his case, and not hold as a reproach against him, the odious imprisonment which he suffered so unjustly.

Twenty-Five Years Ago.—Elder George Goddard, clerk of the Bishops' Meeting, announced last evening, during the session of that body, that the 25th of next month would complete a quarter of a century since he first commenced to act in that capacity; the longest term of any public office in the Church holding a similar position. In looking over the records he had kept in that period, he had observed with much interest the changes made in the history of the various city wards, since their organization, and as an item of information to the meeting, read over the list of Bishops who were acting in Salt Lake City 25 years ago.
