NARROW FERTILE VALLEYS.

Interesting Data Furnished by Hydrographic Branch of United States Geological Survey.

Special Correspondence. Washington, Oct. 29 .- One of the most important districts in Colorado, from industrial standpoint, is that drained by the Grand river and its tributaries, and the development of the natural features of the basin has received no greater aid than that furnished by the investigations of the hydrographic branch of the United States geological survey.

States geological survey. Comprising chiefly a mountainous re-gion, with a high and constant run-off of which not more than 50 per cent is used, the basin offers immense oppor-unities for hydro-electric power de-velopment, and the actual construction of plants is now in progress. Irrigation, largely confined to the lower end of the basin is limited rather by the area of milable land than by insuffi-cient water supply-a condition the re-verse of that prevailing on the astern ences of the Rockies.

The Grand rises on the western slopes of the Rockies. The Grand rises on the western slopes of the mountains, among the high nesks of the front range, and flows in a general south westerly direction across colorado into Utah, where it unites with Green river to form the Colorado. Five of these stations are local-ride on the main stream, viz: at Sulphur Springs, Kremmling, Wolcott, Glenwood Springs and Palisades; the other sta-tions are scattered.
