

**"LAST CHANCE" SKELETONS**

**1 Mining Remains of the Escalante Desert in Southern Utah.**

**Were the Dead Men Prospectors? What of Their Heavily Loaded Wagon?**

To the Editor:

I noticed in a late issue of the *Utah Patriot*, while hunting cattle in the Last Chance country, found the remains of an old encampment in which were found parts of saddle, two or three cases and a blanket, among which were also human bones. The place was visited again during the cattle round-up last spring, and an account of bones, etc., given.

Mr. Levi Stewart and the writer were also there about the time of June last, and endeavored to find more evidence of the missing miners. We found nothing, however, excepting a few bones, which indicate by their decayed condition that they had been there possibly twenty years.

Upon further visit parts of two wagons were found in the pockets of the earth, bearing the names of Mr. W. Powell and "Jameson Chisholm," both having been identified. It was generally understood in this vicinity that parties under the direction of a man by the name of Powell were in that country prospecting for gold, and it is believed that they were recently killed by Indians. Various stories are current to the effect that prospectors were through the country a number of years ago, and extracted a quantity of gold until the Indians came upon them, when all were either killed or driven out by Indians, and their treasure never recovered, although several ineffectual attempts have been made to locate it.

Upon further visit in the Last Chance country about two miles from the Colorado river, there is a total absence of wearing apparel (excepting coats) at the camp, condition which would indicate by the fact that it is not worn a coat, and a blanket, and a heavy rug was unengaged on. Mr. Tyrrell proved the west end of Monroe was invited to take a ride with him, and he was shot dead in the jilt. Justice Hugley gave him twenty-five days. The cartridges were recovered and returned to the gun store.

**French Road.**

There are five classes of roads, known as national, departmental, grand metropolitan, common interest, and ordinary. Vicinal. The first are those most difficult to construct, and are made in order to connect the different departments. Most of them are old, some more ancient than the nationally important. They were the great military and diligential roads before the creation of railroads. The other four are in this study, both because of their antiquity and because the people of the town had scarcely anything to do with their construction. Only five of them cross the department, two hun-

dred miles of this sort of road lying within the boundaries.

The greatest and most dangerous of highways are the departmental roads, which are to the Town what the national roads are to France. There are thirty-three of them, five hundred and eighty miles in length, and they were built and are in order, with the funds of the whole department.

The three remaining classes—grand communication, common interest, and ordinary vicinal, whose nature is to serve the connecting and connecting roads, and which are today fully developed and known as the new name, vicinal roads. They are to be counted by scores and measured by hundreds of miles. They are the work of the communes, towns, and villages, and as far as possible interesting to us, as Theodore Macaulay, in *Chaucer's Life*.
