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as honest, patriotic, independent commonwealth, cannot insist upon others bearing a financial burden which is her own and which she has the ability to carry. But there is no reason to assume that the financial burden in a territory cannot be made heavier than in a state, and the people be measurably poorer in proportion to it. This is evident in Utah's own experience, for in no capital today the aggregate rate of taxation is higher than it is in the entire state of Utah. Under state rule the people are at greater liberty to reduce expenses than when they are subject to the legislative and administrative whims of the controlling power which may be exercised over the territory as at present constituted.

Besides being antagonistic to the spirit of patriotism which inspires every truly American heart, the circular under consideration contains another fatal defect in the necessity of its statement of finances; and a cause which has to resort to this subterfuge for an argument must be essentially a bad one. It is stated in the circular that the present expense of the territorial government to the people of Utah, exclusive of schools, is \$1,000,000. This is a gross statement, for the actual expense is now paid by the federal government. In this statement there is a failure to include executive, judicial and other expenses not met by the territory, and also failure to include gains by the territorial government requiring fees, etc., in going to the state treasury, which would materially change the relation of the figures, and would actually show a gain on the side of the statehood.

While all this, the circular wholly ignores the fact that by the change to a state, Utah will secure more than seven million acres of land for school and other public purposes. Thus it may be seen that the statement of the circular as an inaccurate one as to its motive is representative.

The News will not argue that there may not be a necessity for increase of revenue to carry on the various departments of this government. But we say that with the amount of income available to the state, and with the proper exercise of the power to adjust municipal, county and state taxes, which would be full local self-government, an economical administration may, in view of the advantages gained, reduce the aggregate burden in the state below what it now is in the territory to the taxpayer. Hence the cry of increased taxation, in comparison with present practices, is a slogan which will not frighten the patriotic, intelligent voter on the statehood question. In the matter of privileges and powers, with all attendant responsibilities, statehood for Utah is as long welcomed by all her people who delight in American freedom as a matter of patriotism and independence, every voter who has a pride in the full liberty of the institutions of the Great Republic will glory in casting his ballot for the statehood which is to be Utah's charter as one of the American Union of States.

REVOLUTION IN ARMENIA.

The most alarming news yet received from Asiatic Turkey is that 25,000 armed Armenians are in open revolt against the government. This means that the oppressed people are in the very midst of making a desperate struggle for liberty and independence. If they can, a movement to which the interested European powers must take part in some way, either for or against Islam. It is impossible at present to forecast what proportions this insurrection may assume, but the fact that it has broken out is evidence of the fact that the Armenians are no longer content with the status quo. They are more than ready to do it in their own hands. The Greeks, scattered all over Syria, the chief cities of Egypt and the islands of the eastern Mediterranean sea, the Christians in the mountainous regions, and the various people of Mesopotamia and Armenia, and other principalities in Europe, however widely they may differ in traditions, religion and customs, meet in common ground in their sentiment against Turkish misrule. That the situation is one of grave importance, further, is indicated by the fact that at present activity is being shown among the Russian troops along the southern border of the case's empire.

Information is now leaking out that these unsatisfactory results are due to jealousy between England and her associates in the matter. Hence the Ottoman empire must have in, owing to the fact of corruption that has been so common in the empire for centuries. When this happens Europe will be forced to meet on the spot, and it is hardly conceivable that an amicable agreement can be reached as to the plans of re-organization.

SENATORS AND PRESIDENTS.

It is a curious fact in American political history that no man has ever been elected to the presidency who was a senator at the time of his candidacy. The one who came nearest to making an exception to the rule was General Sherman, who was in fact senator-elect, though he would not have taken his seat in that body until the date when he actually took the oath as President. Senators Cullum, Allison, Sherman and others may therefore find it difficult to derive much comfort from precedent, although the first named lately declared that there were quite a number of our Presidents who had first been senators. The statement is true enough, but, as this Chicago Times-Herald somewhat correctly observes, Senator Cullum does not come within the historic range of his precedent, for such senators as were successful presidential candidates were not of the first office before they were named for and gained the second. In ten instances our Presidents had been at one time or another members of the upper house of Congress, these being James Monroe, John Quincy Adams, Andrew Jackson, Martin Van Buren, William Henry Harrison, John Tyler, Franklin Pierce, James Buchanan, Andrew Johnson and Benjamin Harrison. But to effect these ten, history names at least twelve who have been defeated either in convention or as candidates; and, as already stated, there is not a single case where the President was elected direct from the Senate and while he was in that body was still unexpired. No wonder Mr. Reed, Mr. McKinley, Mr. Campbell, Mr. Hanna and others are not hurrying just now to get into the more exalted congressional chamber.
