INSPECTION OF SCHOOL CHILDREN

Or. King Proposes Plan to Stop Spread of Scarlet Fever.

WRITES TO SCHOOL BOARD.

Recites the Alarming Increase of Scarlet Fever Among the Public School Children.

Health Commissioner King has sent a communication to the board of education in which he calls the attention of the board to the increase of scarlet fever and "smallpox." Thinking that the best means to prevent the further spread of those diseases among the shildren would be to have the latter in-

children would be to have the latter inspected by a competent physician, he
requests the board to carry out that
suggestion. The letter is as follows:
"Gentlemen:—It is proper to call your
earnest attention to the prevalence of
contagious diseases among the school
children of this city.

"Since the opening of the school year
there has been a steady increase in the
number of cases of scarlet fever. In
August there were seven cases; in September, seventeen; in October twentyeight and thus far in November, twen
ty-seven cases have been reported to ty-seven cases have been reported to the board of health. This condition is certainly deplorable and calls for your serious consideration and your co-oper-ation with the board of health in ef-forts to isolate and quarantine and otherwise prevent the spread of contagious diseases.

tagious diseases.

"Your superintendent and teachers have merited just commendation for their cordial assistance in reporting cases of contagious diseases and in

their cordial assistance in reporting cases of contagious diseases and in their watchful care over the health of their pupils, but much more is needed than can be accomplished in this way. "As an illustration of how scarlet fever is spread among school children, I will take the liberty of citing a particular instance which is one among many of a similar character. A report came to the health office to the effect that a child was sick at a certain place and scarlet fever was suspected. I immediately visited the house and found a boy about 8 years of age in a state of profuse desquamation from scarlet profuse desquamation from scarlet fever. The parents said he had had a sore throat about ten days before, and a brigat rash all over his body, but that he didn't seem very sick, and they thought it did not amount to anything,

thought it did not amount to anything, and so had not called a physician. Fortunately the teacher had noticed the early sickness of this child and had sent him home, but doubtless there are many cases of a similar character attending school right along.

"It has been a very fortunate circumstance that the death rate from scarlet fever during the last year has been very low. There is no security, however, that the character of the disease will continue of so mild a type. If the usual severity of the disease should be re-established there would be at least eight deaths every month from scarlet fever among the school children of this city. Before this time shall come I would most respectfully, but urgently, recommend that your honorable gently, recommend that your honorable body provide for the inspection of the children in the public schools by an expert in diseases of children. Only lack of means in the health department deters the health commissione from employing such assistance, and it is but ujstice to add that it is a physical impossibility for him to do this im-portant work himself and attend to the other duties of the office. I shall take pleasure in rendering all assistance in my power to your honorable body in directing and supervising the work, as inspection as time will permit.
