

## Winter Journey from Moscow to Mukden

MUKDEN, Jan. 14.—I left London the day after Boxing day, spent my New Year's day in the Trans-siberian Express somewhere east of Moscow, have been traveling since then for 14 days by train, with the exception of crossing Lake Baikal—and it is New Year's day again! The 1st of January in England is the 19th of Decem-

ber in Russia; consequently I have enjoyed all the benefits of two Christ-mas and New Year's days within a month. Having crossed all the great water highways of Asia, now frozen and converted into white sleigh roads, I at length reached Irkutsk and the great Baikal lake, which cuts in two the great iron highway to the east, in the clear windless air one could see for

miles, and across the white plain the saw-backed ridges of the mountains of Transbaikalia looked as if they were but a mile or two away. The thermometer showed minus 20 degrees. Reaching Irkutsk, I found the city within a minute or two and mustache were frozen to the fur of my shouba, but the stillness of the air led me to doubt the accuracy of the thermometer (I saw the condensed water from the locomotives freezing in stales, the icicles as it dripped from the cylinders. The whole landscape was covered with a white dust. It was dry and hard as sand, but it was snow, and it gleamed and glistened in the rays of the sun like myriads of diamonds. Presently a huge four-funnelled ship

appeared, although you could not imagine it to be a ship unless you were already aware of the fact. It looked more like a huge self-propelled sleigh. She was making her way along a track of lumpy broken ice, which disappeared ahead and reappeared astern, giving the idea that she was just sliding over it. It was the great steam ferry and ice breaker, Baikal, and presently she had discharged her load of empty railway wagons, received 25 full ones, and we started on our way across the lake. Baikal is a huge plain of ice, at present about three feet thick, and getting thicker every minute. In some places it looks like polished black marble; in others it is virgin white. A clearly-defined track runs across it, the path of

the ferries Baikal and Angara. It is the duty of the former to keep it open. She crosses four times in the 24 hours. If she missed a day it would take her nearly a day to break open the road again. She crushes through it with a ceaseless grinding noise, like a huge steam roller smashing over Gargantuan sugar lumps, and these lumps bob up serenely and start freezing together again directly she passes. The art of navigation finds no scope for enterprise here: it is like running on a railroad track, or driving between hedgerows. I got across Baikal and into the well-warmed express, and have passed the mountains, and have run through endless flat plains—flat, not rolling—all snow-covered; and now I am nearing

Mukden, the capital of Manchuria.—London Daily Graphic.
