Worcester, Mass., Aug. 21.—A frightful road-end collision occurred at the station of the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad at 12:30 p.m. today, when an express train, which was carrying 100 passengers, crashed into the rear of a passenger train, resulting in the death of seven passengers and the injury of many others.

As a result, 100 persons were killed, and many others were injured. The injured were taken to the hospital, and the bodies of the seven who died were taken to the morgue.
