

NOW DEPENDS ON NATIONAL LEAGUE.

Will Meet Tomorrow to Decide on Salt Lake's Baseball Outlook

MAY HAVE OUTLAW BALL.

Fans Believe Strong League Will be Formed Regardless of National Action in Matter.

Tomorrow and Thursday in New York city the board of control of the National baseball league will hear the evidence which will decide what Salt Lake may have in the way of recognized baseball next season. The board has already decided that the Pacific National league is dead, it having died naturally through the dwindling of its clubs below the four required to constitute a team. W. H. Lucas, who was the league's president, and more or less the father of baseball in this territory, attempted to his protest to make his league as so to compete with Spokane and Butte, four west coast towns, two in Canada and two in the south. His efforts were rewarded by the Pacific national league for a new six-town circuit. Then began the long quarrel which called forth the meeting in Butte Saturday last, when men were seen from Butte, Salt Lake, Spokane, Helena, Boise and Great Falls. They had previously attempted to show the Pacific National league was not alive and had elected a new president, W. E. Johnson, of this city, to replace Lucas, and the meeting went ahead without considering all the plans of Lucas and his new league. They were invited to practice at night, and the only thing that seemed logical was to prove a mass of evidence to submit to the national council that was doing nothing but delay in the action of the board.

Waiting for Protection. The fall meeting of the one question which was not agreed upon was that of going ahead with the national protection was refused. Salt Lake, Ogden, Spokane and Helena, care little whether the league is protected or not, and were for going ahead at all costs. The other three cities, however, and Great Falls, had previously attempted to show the Pacific National league was still alive and had elected a new president, W. E. Johnson, of this city, to replace Lucas, and the meeting went ahead without considering all the plans of Lucas and his new league. They were invited to practice at night, and the only thing that seemed logical was to prove a mass of evidence to submit to the national council that was doing nothing but delay in the action of the board.

Lucas Laughed at League. Ex-President Lucas is not losing sleep over the new protection. He is fond of saying that "falling behind" is not in the Canadian country carrying out his plan for forming clubs. This is his statement concerning the new league, and the end result.

Shortly after his return from San Francisco last July Mr. Williams got busy with the wires, and asked the other P. N. L. clubs to join him in a request to me to withdraw my demand for protection. The fall meeting of the national protection was held in the Hotel Colorado, and was not just an anxious one. Williams to curtail the playing schedule. The men are now waiting for a decision which will reverse the action previously taken, and recognize the N. P. league as still exist-
