Mrs. Byron Crosby Dies After Two Surgical Operations.

For the removal of these a second operation was found necessary. While she rallied from the effects of the second operation, she grew worse until the end came as stated. The deceased, in addition to her husband, leaves three small children to mourn her death. She was the sister of Henry Arnold of the Salt Lake City Railroad company, and of Mrs. John Burns. She was but thirty-one years of age, and had many friends. Her funeral will take place from the Simonsen home, 124 South Main, beginning at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. STOCKMEN MUST GET PERMITS.

Otherwise Their Horses, Cattle and Sheep Will be Kept Off

ALL THE FOREST RESERVES.

New Order Comes from the Secretary of the Interior—Permits to be Procured from E. H. Callister.

Secretary E. H. Callister of the Utah Wool-growers' association and special live stock census agent for Utah, today gave out a piece of information that will be of unusual interest and importance to the live stock men of the State.

Heretofore it has been necessary for the sheep men only to secure permits to graze their sheep upon the forest reserves. But Mr. Callister is in receipt of instructions from Government Forest Reserve Agent George F. Bucher that an order has been made by the secretary of the interior that horse and cattle men will be included this year, and all must secure permits without delay or have their animals kept off the reserves. Secretary Callister said today that he would be at his office from May 24th to May 29th to receive applications for permits. He will not appear in person as the permits will not be granted to representatives of the stockmen. Mr. Callister is of the opinion that the stockmen will not appear for permits during that period.

Mr. Callister has already entered up his census work and expects to play a double role while the stockmen are in town, that of issuing permits and securing information regarding the enumeration of live stock.

SCANDINAVIAN JUBILEE.

Committees are Busy Arranging for the Big Celebration.

The committees in charge of the big Scandinavian jubilee are exceedingly busy these days arranging an interesting program for that notable occasion. As is well understood the object is to commemorate the introduction of Mormonism into the Scandinavian countries by Apostle Erastus Snow in 1847.

Special rates have been obtained from all of the railroads running into and out of Salt Lake. This fact together with the further fact that various entertainments and instructive character are being provided for should be a strong inducement to visitors. It is estimated that a good many thousand Scandinavians will visit Salt Lake during the jubilee week of that portion of it running from June 14th to 17th inclusive. An immense souvenir album of artistic design will be issued. It will contain half-tone photographs of 400 or more Scandinavians who have figured prominently in the history of Mormonism during the half century which commemorates the jubilee. The album of events will also be published and business houses are now being canvassed for advertisements which are to adorn its pages. The various committees are working hard to make the outcome of what will probably be the most representative gathering of Scandinavians ever held in the great West.

PERPETUATE HIS MEMORY.

Memorial Tablet Erected in Rutgers' College in Honor of Colonel Breterton.

In Rutgers' College chapel at New Brunswick, N. J., has been erected a memorial tablet in memory of Lieut. Col. John J. Breterton of the Thirty-third infantry, volunteers, and captain in the Twenty-fourth infantry, regular army, who during a campaign in the Philippines was killed by a bullet from the hand of a Filipino. The tablet is an elegant one of bronze and was erected by the college because Col. Breterton was once instructor in military science at that place. The following inscription is engraved on the tablet:

Lieut. Col. John J. Breterton, Thirty-third regiment, U. S. Volunteers, born January 11, 1857, Professor Military Science, Rutgers' College, 1881-1890. Died December 2, 1899, at Santo Tomas, Luzon, Philippine Islands. Life's race well won, now cometh rest. Colonel Breterton, a stationer, was Fort Douglas with the Twenty-fourth infantry, and while here made many warm friends.
