THE AMERICAN

WIRE FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, 29.—The Secretary

of the Interior has decided a question

which came up on the application

of the Central Pacific Railroad

Company for patents to certain land

lying opposite a coalfield and

accepted part of its road. As the

Central Pacific Railroad Company

has not completed its entire line within

the time prescribed by the granting

of the question thus presented to

the Secretary is similar to that de-

cided by the U. S. Supreme Court

in the case of Schuylburg, of Kan-

sas, and Harrison, in which the

Court held that the provision for

completing the road within a cer-

tain time was a condition of the

grant, and that although the time for

building the road had expired the

grant remained unexpired, and the

land did not and could not revert

without the intervention of legis-

lative or judicial action, and without

such action no effect whatever could

be given to the forfeiture clause.

The Secretary says in view of the

decision which was made more than

eight years ago, and since reaffirm-

ed, and the further fact that al-

though the attention of Congress

has been repeatedly called to the

effect of the decision and no action

has been taken, it must be presu-

med that Congress intended to

grant companies to have the benefit

of the decision.

The committee appointed to in-
