EASTERN.

New York, 7:—McDonnell, the alleged principal in the forgery on the Bank of England, was brought before Judge Woodruff to-day, on the charge of forgery.

McDonnell, who is a native of the United States, was arrested in London, and is now in the custody of the British authorities.

Up to noon to-day the only new point in the Mutual Life Insurance Company investigation was that the police commissioner Maunier had obtained six thousand dollars, said to have been used at Washington to secure the cooperation of the police in the investigation.

The men of the New York Gas Company are the only ones who have struck, the employees of other companies refusing thus far to join them.

The police in large numbers are still on duty. To-day is cloudy and dark. Banks, mercantile houses and saloons down town are lighted by candles and gas lamps.

Abundance of firemen has been suspended for the present.

Washington, 4:—A dispatch from Laredo, Texas, April 1st, says the U. S. frontier commission was on its way to Laredo.

The Mexican commission had held a joint session with the American commission on the subject of the disturbances.
