GENERAL.

NEW YORK, 13.—The Times special from London says the position of the government on the treaty creates great political excitement. The general expectation is, that there will be an adjournment of the Geneva conference.

The Herald's London special says a Bombay telegram contains information from Arab sources, that Livingstone is well, and that Stanley is at Uji, and is coming to the coast with Livingstone's letters. It appears that Livingstone traversed the north end of Lake Yamganka, on the way to Uji, where obtaining stores he returned to Uyuwende. He refuses to leave the country, intending to explore the underground passage between the Lakes Uyuwende and Noissa.

A Washington special says the supplemental treaty article, adopted by the Senate, concludes as follows:

In consideration that the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, consents to the establishment of a new feature of international law, for the guidance of both nations to the effect that either of the contracting powers shall be held responsible for the acts of its citizens as agents of either government, in favor of any belligerent power with which the government may be at war, he will make no claim on the part of the United States in respect to indirect damages as affirmed said before the tribunal of arbitration at Geneva.

NEW YORK, 13.—About ten thousand iron and metal workers will strike Monday for eight hours.

WASHINGTON, 13.—The reporting meeting of Democrats here, to take steps to nominate a straight Democratic ticket in the event of the Baltimore convention endorsing Greeley, it appears, was, if held at all, merely informal, that the number of persons was not so large as reported, and the alleged proceedings had no significance.

The war department is strengthening its forts on the South Gulf coast; and the navy department is placing its supplies of stores at all the naval stations on these coasts, in accordance with the desire of government to be prepared for any emergencies.

BINGHAMPTON, N. Y., 13.—There was a terrific storm of wind and rain here yesterday afternoon. Robbed up menagerie and circus tents were blown down while crowded with people, and a cage with animals was overturned. The crowd was terribly frightened, and nobody was seriously injured. Lightning struck the Congregational church, the Fourth ward schoolhouse, and four other buildings. A number of unfinished buildings were blown down.

At Rawlinsville, N. Y., the lightning struck the school house, killed a little girl named Merritt, and stunned several others.

Boston, 13.—During a terrible thunder storm last night, Hugh Graham was killed by lightning, in Lexington. Mrs. Flaherty and Mrs. O'Brien, Waltham, and Lewis Ball in Acton.
