> Destructive Fire-Loss of Life. gri) CINCINNATI, 3 .- Pestering's Clgar Box Factory was burned this morning. Twenty-five girls were working in the upper stories. It is reported that four of them have perished in the flames.

> Later-The fire originated in the cellar. An attempt was made to extinguish it without the aid of the fire department, but was un- Ck successful. After reaching the first floor the flames spread with fearful rapidity, and in a short time reached the roof. The employes, mostly girls, were at work in the third and ourth stories. Some escaped through the windows and upon the roofs of other buildings, but it is feared that eight or ten perished in the flames. Four bodies have been ecovered, so disfigured that they are almost beyond recognition; pieces of clothing led to the identification of Mary Nurre, Mana-Kueb, Frank Studair, and Anna Fratger. John Blanchard, engineer of the factory, died soon after from injuries receiv-

> ed. Two girls, and one man, Isaac Scefield, were so badly burned that they will probably die. From the Clo factory the fire spread to six frame and one brick building, all of which will prove a total loss. The amount of the losses is not yet estimated. The insurance, as far as known, is \$15,000.
