

TERRITORIAL BOARD.

The Equalizers hostile to the face of the People's Ex-

Yesterday Hon. John E. Booth of Provo, A. R. Richardson of Park City, M. B. Davies of Salt Lake and W. W. Mangum, members of the territorial board of equalization, were in Ogden on official business. A consultation was held during the day with the local board of tax equalizers, the purpose of consultation being to get out on the valuation of all property in the county, as advised in the resolutions lately adopted by the county court. The visiting gentlemen favored setting aside the resolutions and thus leave the issue on the old scale. This, however, did not meet with the approval of the local board who believe that the citizens are overburdened with taxes during the financial crisis of the present time. No agreement was reached but it is generally believed that after further consideration the proposed resolution will be made.

PROVO, UTAH, AUGUST 18, 1903. HIGH ASSESSMENTS. The Rate of Valuation of Provo Real Estate.

A mass meeting of the citizens of Provo was held last night at the court house to take into consideration the high rate of assessment on Provo real estate. It was estimated that the assessed value of the real estate in Provo city and precinct is at least 25 per cent higher than the valuation of similar real estate elsewhere in the county and Territory, and therefore we request the county board of equalization to reduce such valuation to an equality with similar real estate in the county and Territory. It was stated by several speakers that while business property in Provo was assessed at \$25 a foot, in Springville business property was assessed at \$10 a foot, in Spanish Fork at \$5 a foot, and in Logan at \$10 a foot. Similar discrepancies were pointed out in regard to residential property. Messrs. Hovey, Smith, Myron Tanner and John H. Miller were appointed a committee to investigate the matter and confer with the county board of equalization and also the territorial board, with a view of securing a reduction of the assessed value of Provo's real estate.

To Quiet Title.

Suit has been brought by King & Haute, in behalf of Provo city, against the Provo Beach Canal and Irrigation company and a number of other irrigation companies and several individuals, to quiet the title of Provo city to lands within one hundred feet of the water of Provo river. The several interests in the waters of Provo river have never been determined and have always heretofore been a source of contention.

Charged With Grand Larceny.

Prison Nutter was yesterday bound over in the sum of \$1,000 to await the action of the grand jury on the charge of grand larceny by Commissioner Dudley. Nutter is charged with acquiring property stolen in the southern precinct with somebody else's hand on it.
